ELIGIBILITY

Scholarship winners will need to show documentation of acceptance and contract to attend the post-secondary program before scholarship funds are released to the student.

TIMELINES

Scholarship applications are due on or before April 15 May 15, 2021. The application can be submitted by mail to the address above. Scholarship winners will be announced this summer, at the July 4 picnic.

A panel of three volunteer senior citizen Lake Lenape members will be scoring your application. All judging will be done anonymously; the scorers will not be given the names of the applicants. Any names that appear on any of the components of the application will be redacted prior to scoring.

Essay Prompt #1 - 650 words or less



Kelsey Bederka was born and raised at Lake Lenape and worked as one of our lifeguards at the age of 16. As a small child and later as a teen, she very much enjoyed spending time at the lake with family and friends. Her close friends say she was always the first one to jump in the lake early each season and the last one to jump in once it got cold. Clearly, she was someone who truly loved Lake Lenape.

Please explain why Lake Lenape is special to you.

Essay Prompt #2 - 650 words or less - Please choose from one of the essay prompts below.

- 1. Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.
- 2. The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
- 3. Reflect on a time when you questioned or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?
- 4. Describe a problem you've solved or a problem you'd like to solve. It can be an intellectual challenge, a research query, an ethical dilemma—anything that is of personal importance, no matter the scale. Explain its significance to you and what steps you took or could be taken to identify a solution.
- 5. Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.
- 6. Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?
- 7. Share an essay on any topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design.
- 8. Tell a story from your life, describing an experience that either demonstrates your character or helped to shape it.
- 9. Describe a time when you made a meaningful contribution to others in which the greater good was your focus. Discuss the challenges and rewards of making your contribution.
- 10. Has there been a time when you've had a long-cherished or accepted belief challenged? How did you respond? How did the challenge affect your beliefs?
- 11. What is the hardest part of being a teenager now? What's the best part? What advice would you give a younger sibling or friend (assuming they would listen to you)?
