The theme is “Building Bridges”. Submissions can be written, art, performance or presentation. However, the Judges must be able to make the connection between the Theme and the Student’s submission . Is the student’s submission of the theme “Building Bridges” clear to the Judge?						
Does the written, art/performance or presentation appear to be an original work?						
Was the ECOC online application form fully completed with the correct required attachment? See Rules: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Written submissions (Essay, Short Story, Script for play, Poem, Research Paper) must be double spaced Microsoft word or google document and between 1,500 and 2,000 words – no word count requirement for poem. • Visual Art (Art or Sculpture) Take photo of piece. Upload photo and a 500-word essay describing how your item addresses the theme. • Art & Performance (Song, Skit, Speech, Rap/Spoken Word) Upload word or google document of the actual text. Also upload 500-word essay describing how your piece addresses the theme – presentation time limit 2-5 min. • Art & Performance (Dance). Upload a 500-word essay describing how your dance addresses the theme – performance time limit 2-5 min. • Presentation (Power Point/Prezi) Upload actual presentation & upload 500-word essay describing how your item addresses the theme – presentation limited 5 -7 min. • Presentation (Video) Upload a 500-word essay describing how your video addresses the theme. No time restriction. • Other: Attach a 500-word essay describing how your submission addresses the theme.
