

PERPETUAL CONSECRATION: Lesson 3

Jeremiah 29:11-14 KJV For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the LORD, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end. (12) Then shall ye call upon me, and ye shall go and pray unto me, and I will hearken unto you. (13) And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart. (14) And I will be found of you, saith the LORD: and I will turn away your captivity, and I will gather you from all the nations, and from all the places whither I have driven you, saith the LORD; and I will bring you again into the place whence I caused you to be carried away captive.

1. In verse 12, what does “Then shall ye call upon me” point to, what is meant by “Then”?

2. Why don’t the LORD just plainly say: “pray unto me and I will hear you”?

3. What is the LORD really looking for from the captives in Babylon?

4. Why getting the people to prayer so important to the LORD?

5. Why don’t the people have an immediate desire to pray?

6. Would the LORD listen to their prayers before this specific time? Why or why not.

7. What seems to be the mindset of these captives?

8. When they begin praying unto the LORD, “pray unto me and I will hearken unto you”, what should their prayer be?

9. In verse 12, what is being revealed about their attitude and their connection with the LORD?
