(31) And when they had prayed, the place was shaken where they were assembled together; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they spake the word of God with boldness.

PRAYER



Ananias answered, "Here I am, Lord." (11) The Lord said to him, "Get up and go to the street called Straight Street. Find the house of Judas and ask for a man named Saul from the city of Tarsus. He is there now, praying.

Acts 9:17 ERV So Ananias left and went to the house of Judas. He laid his hands on Saul and said, "Saul, my brother, the Lord Jesus sent me. He is the one you saw on the road when you came here. He sent me so that you can see again and also be filled with the Holy Spirit."

I. PURPOSE OF FASTING AND PRAYING

A. HELPS OFFER OUR BODY TO THE LORD.

Romans 12:1-2 CEV Dear friends, God is good. So I beg you to offer your bodies to him as a living sacrifice, pure and pleasing. That's the most sensible way to serve God. (2) Don't be like the people of this world, but let God change the way you think. Then you will know how to do everything that is good and pleasing to him.

Fasting and praying helps us weaken our body and will to accept the LORD's strength and help us to live a spiritual life.

B. HELPS DEVELOP INTIMACY WITH THE LORD.

1 John 1:3 ERV ... The fellowship we share together is with God the Father and his Son Jesus Christ.

Fasting and prayer helps us build a strong bond and connection with our LORD and Savior Jesus Christ and our Father in heaven.

C. HELPS STRENGTHEN SPIRITUAL AWARENESS AND SENSITIVITY.

1 Corinthians 2:14 BBE For the natural man is not able to take in the things of the Spirit of God: for they seem foolish to him, and he is not

able to have knowledge of them, because such knowledge comes only through the Spirit.

Fasting and prayer opens our heart and spirit to hear and listen to the voice of the Spirit of GOD for spiritual guidance.

II. THE BENEFITS OF FASTING:

Matthew 6:17-18 KJV But thou, when thou fastest, anoint thine head, and wash thy face; (18) That thou appear not unto men to fast, but unto thy Father which is in secret: and thy Father, which seeth in secret, shall reward thee openly.

- a. We gain authority, clarity, and closeness with God.
- b. We experience the indwelling presence and power of the Holy Spirit.

III. TYPES OF FASTS

- a. Absolute Fast No drinking or eating.
- Partial Fast [liquid only] or [no sweets and no snacks] or [no meats] or [vegetables only] or [no TV, minimal phone, and social media]
- c. Time of fast 12midnight to 3:00pm or Sunrise to Sunset or 24 hours
- d. Fast Focus Read the bible, meditate on the scriptures, and pray.

IV. THE BENEFITS OF PRAYING:

Matthew 6:6 KJV But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly.

- a. Communicating with the LORD.
- b. Strengthening our relationship & connection with the LORD.
- c. Receiving a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit.
- d. Builds faith in the LORD.
