THIS MONTH IN MILITARY HISTORY JULY 2024



4 July 1776: The Declaration of Independence is signed marking the official separation of America from Britain. "The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America, When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

2-6 July 1777: The Siege of Fort Ticonderoga took place as Major General John Burgoyne during his push down Lake Champlain as part of the British plan to split the colonies. On 5 July Maj Gen Arthur St. Clair under the cover of darkness evacuated the sick and wounded and marched his me out of the fort. The British did not realize that Ticonderoga was abandoned until 6 July.

<u>8 July 1777</u>: The Battle of Fort Anne, though technically a British victory at the time with the Americans retreating to Fort Edward. The battle in Fort Anne did delay Burgoyne's push to Saratoga, allowing Gen George Washington to bring in reinforcements to bolster the defenses in Saratoga.

1-3 July 1863: The Battle of Gettysburg was the turning point of the war and was Lee's last attempt at pushing north.

4 July 1863: The 47 day Siege of Vicksburg ends with a Union Victory splitting the Confederacy.

<u>1 July 1898</u>: Col. Theodore Roosevelt and his Rough Riders are victorious over Spanish forces at the Battle of San Juan Hill Cuba. Col. Roosevelt receives the Medal of Honor for his actions.

28 July 1914: Following the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand on 28 June 1914, World War I erupts when Austro-Hungary declared war on Serbia.

<u>5 July-23 Aug 1943</u>: The Battle of Kursk was military history's largest tank battle takes place on the Eastern Front, involving 6,000 tanks, 4,000 aircraft and 2 million troops. Russia is victorious and stops Hitler from conquering Russia.

27 July 1953: The Korean Armistice Agreement was signed, and the DMZ was created. North and South Korea are still in a state of war as a formal peace treaty was never signed.

<u>July 1965</u>: President Johnson calls for 50,000 more ground troops to be sent to Vietnam, increasing the draft to 35,000 each month.

July 1975: North and South Vietnam are formally unified as the Socialist Republic of Vietnam.

22 July 2003: The Mosul Raid led to the death of Saddam's sons Uday and Qusay.
