It's not right that people try to exploit them. This presentation will equip you with essential knowledge to recognize and avoid these threats. Learn about current scams, the warning signs of fraud, and steps to safeguard your identity. Gain the tools and knowledge to combat identity theft and scams and help your fellow vets too.
