March is Women's History Month. The Veterans of Foreign Wars Ladies Auxiliary was formed on September 14, 1914. The first National Encampment (the equivalent of a National Convention) was held in Pittsburgh, PA that year, where 47 members gathered to adopt temporary Bylaws. It was a primary goal of the organization to welcome members regardless of income, religious affiliation or ethnicity, in order for the membership to best reflect the nation and veterans members would be serving. For 100 years, the Ladies Auxiliary was led by strong, capable, caring women including thousands of women members who worked tirelessly to ensure that our nation's veterans were not only not forgotten, but also honored, aided and supported. In July 2015, it was determined to accept men and change the name "Ladies Auxiliary" to Auxiliary.

Thank you to all of you that made it possible for the delivery of Valentine's cards to the Glens Falls Center, Warren Center, and VA Hospital in Albany. I'm sure these made Veterans day a bit brighter. Volunteers are needed March 26th to help pack Easter bags at the VA Hospital more to be discussed at our March meeting. 1 March 1776	French Minister Charles Gravier advised the Spanish to support Americans in their Revolution against England.	
1 March 2002	OPERATION ANACONDA begins in Afghanistan	
1 March 2003	Khalid Shaikh Mohammed, the suspected Sept. 11, 2001 mastermind, was taken into custody in Islama- bad Pakistan.	
2 March 1867	Jacob Zeilin, Colonel Commandant of the Marine Corps was promoted to the rank of Brigadier Gen- eral Commandant. Marking the first time Congress authorized this rank in the Marine Corps.	
2 March 1965	OPERATION ROLLING THUNDER begins	
3 March 1915	The office of the Chief of Naval Operation was established. ADM William Benson is appointed the first CNO.	
8 March 1958	The USS WISCONSIN (BB-64) is decommissioned, leaving the Navy without an active battleship for the first time since 1895.	
15 March 1919	Veterans of the American Expeditionary Force founded the American Legion in Paris.	
15 March 2010	Corporal Frank Buckles aged 110, the last surviving US Veteran of World War 1 was buried at Arling- ton National Cemetery.	
19 March 1917	Navy Department authorizes enrollment of women in the Naval Reserve.	
20 March 2003	The U.S led coalition of 40 nations, begin the military invasion of Iraq, beginning under OPERATION IRAQI LIBERATION, later renamed OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM.



VA expands Health Care Eligibility for all Veterans exposed to toxins and other hazards during military service!!

VA just announced that all Veterans who were exposed to toxins and other hazards while serving our country at home or abroad – including all Veterans who served in the Vietnam War, Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan, or any other combat zone after 9/11 – are now eligible to enroll directly in VA health care without first applying for VA benefits.

Additionally, Veterans who never deployed but were exposed to toxins or hazards while training or on active duty in the United States are also eligible to enroll.

This historic expansion of health care comes after VA eliminated the phased-in approach to health care eligibility called for by the PACT Act – meaning that millions of Veterans are becoming eligible for VA health care up to eight years earlier than written into law.

Veterans are encouraged to act NOW and get the care you, your families, or your survivors deserve. VA provides the best and most affordable health care for Veterans in America – and this is your chance to apply.
