LEGISLATION

There are lots of positive things going on in the state of Texas as well as nationally with the return of President Trump!

The Texas House elected Rep Dustin Burrows of Lubbock to be Speaker with the help of Democrat votes. He did not appoint Democrat committee chairs as has been done in the past, but did appoint Democrat vice chairs.

One of the first pieces of legislation proposed will create a school choice program starting with 100,000 vouchers worth \$10,000 each with an extra \$1,500 for special needs children and \$2000 for homeschool families.


Low income and special needs students will be prioritized if more than 100,000 applications are received. This bill is SB2, showing it is the most important bill after the state budget in the Senate. If Governor Abbot declares it an "emergency item" it could be passed in the Senate as early as next week.

Governor Abbot has ordered state agencies to cooperate with President Trump's deportation effort. The expectation is that some of the money the state has been spending on border security could be redirected now that the federal government is assuming it's constitutional role of securing the border. But in early versions of the budget, the amount has stayed the same.

Lieutenant Governor Dan Patrick has put out a list of his top legislative priorities, including increasing the Homestead exemption by \$40k, reinforcing the electrical grid and placing the 10 Commandments in schools. He also wants to prevent foreign entities from certain countries to buy land in Texas and enact a ban on THC, the active ingredient in marijuana.

On the national stage, President Trump has started his term by signing numerous executive orders on his first day in office to keep promises he made to the voters. We have seen an amazing amount of action in the first 10 days including ending illegal immigration and beginning deportations, rescinding damaging energy restrictions, withdrawing from the Paris climate accord, ending "birthright citizenship" and instituting a hiring freeze, offering severance pay to government workers and instituting reviews for all current spending.

Promises made, promises kept!

SOME STATS ON PRESIDENT'S TRUMP SECOND TERM

Republican support for President Trump heading into his second term is far more solidified than it was when he first took office in 2017:

This time around, more approve of his handling of the presidency, view him as a strong leader, and expect he will improve the country's standing around the world.

94% of Republicans strongly or somewhat approve of how Trump is handling his job as president one week in, while 2% strongly or somewhat disapprove. That compares to 81% of Republicans approving of Trump in January 2017, while 9% disapproved.

Americans are divided in their expectations of how respect for the U.S. around the world will change in the next four years: 40% think the U.S. will be more respected four years from now and 38% think it will be less respected. At the start of Trump's first term in 2017, Americans were somewhat less likely to expect an increase (31%) than a decrease (41%) in global respect for the country during his term.

The policies Trump either has emphasized or has taken steps to implement since taking office last week are highly divisive: All are backed by most Republicans, and nearly all are rejected by most Democrats.



Fundraising involves strategic efforts to gather resources, donations as voluntary gifts, and using the internet as a tool.


