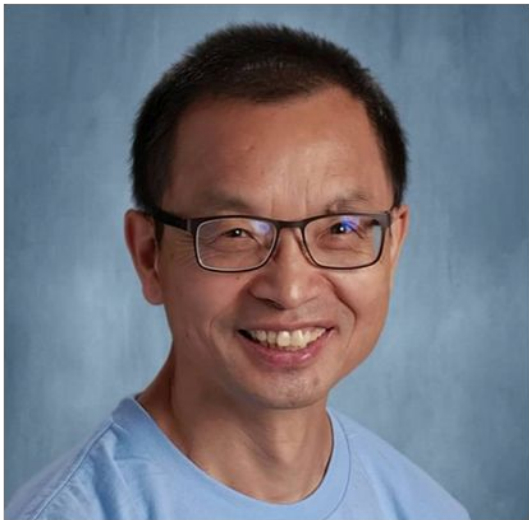

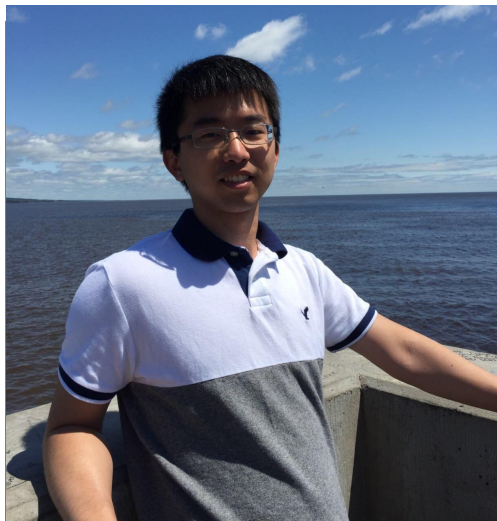

The primary purpose of my teaching Chinese is to equip students with the language skills necessary to communicate effectively and to gain an understanding of Chinese culture and its real-world applications. My learning goals for students include achieving proficiency in speaking, listening, reading, and writing in Chinese, as well as developing intercultural competence and fostering a strong sense of educational equity. 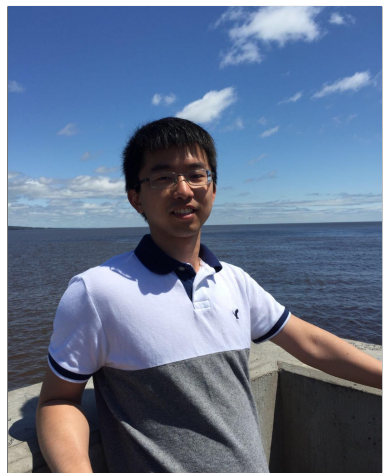
