

- Holographic Universe Theory (Bohm, Pribram)
- → The universe may be a projection of consciousness, where every part contains the whole.
  - Global Consciousness Project
- → Large-scale collective consciousness affects random number generators suggesting that mass focus shapes physical data. (Nelson, 2002)
  - Orch-OR Theory (Penrose & Hameroff)
- → Consciousness arises from quantum events in microtubules—suggesting that intention may be embedded in physical process.
