History:

GBC was formed in Statesville in 1970 as a unique expression of church within the Southern Baptist Convention, where women could hold leadership roles such as deacon and minister; and baptism by immersion was not required for membership. For many years, we met in rented buildings and homes, but by 1981, a permanent building for worship, education and fellowship was constructed. GBC continues to meet in this same building but stays true to the sign we have carried with us throughout our journey: "Grace Baptist Meets Here". Most of the work and life of Grace is outside the church walls. Although we left the Southern Baptist Convention and eventually, the State Baptist Convention, we strive to remain true to our Baptist roots through affiliation with the Alliance of Baptist and Baptist Peace Fellowship of North America. We also have a relationship with the Cooperative Baptist Convention.

Core Values:

- A strong sense of community for its covenant participants
- A commitment to diversity as it welcomes different theological perspectives as well as racial and socioeconomic diversity
- A mission to meet the needs of people who are the less fortunate than we are as well as an increased awareness of social justice issues
- A desire for spiritual growth
- An appreciation for worship that enables us to worship God and to listen to and respond to his voice

Local and National Connections/Alliances:

Throughout our 45+ year history, Grace has been involved in the issues and problems facing the community. This resulted in the creation of a literacy program, a wood ministry, a daycare for lower socio-economic families and dozens of other projects; many of which still exist today. But as needs change, Grace remains attuned to God's call for new ministries. Currently, much of our work involves:

- Delivering meals to 70+ homebound seniors on holidays and in bad weather
- Supporting the work of the local shelter ministry, which operates a soup kitchen, night shelter, emergency shelter and battered women's shelter
- Supporting Iredell Christian Ministries and Yokefellow ministries two local food pantries and resource agencies for those in need
- Supporting Habitat for Humanity, Alzheimer's Awareness,
- Participating in programs to help low performing schools
- Partnering with the NAACP on community issues
- Hosting and organizing community wide interfaith services at Thanksgiving, Christmas (Longest Night/Blue Christmas) and Easter (service and breakfast at the local shelter)

Education and Worship

Grace stresses the importance of continued study, reflection and discussion among our participants. Some examples of this are:

- Annual Davis Lectures featuring noted speakers for a 2-3 nights and open to the community
- Partnership with local Episcopal Church's Education for Ministry classes through the University
 of the South School of Theology
- Lenten Ladies Book Study
- Sunday School classes for all ages

Grace follows the church calendar, but with the guidance of the Worship Committee, we put our own touch to Advent and Lent observances. During the summer, Grace refers to this "ordinary time" as *A Season of Grace* and focuses on a specific topic for the summer months, moving worship to 10 a.m.

With the addition of a readers choir for special seasonal services and the weekly choral offerings from the choir, Grace provides a comfortable setting to be challenged and inspired by a variety of means.

Traditions abound at Grace, including pot lucks and fellowship events, Scary Supper (you have to see it to believe it), cantatas, Good Friday Peace Walk, and more.

Community

Statesville is the county seat for Iredell County, nestled between the Piedmont and Foothill areas of North Carolina. Rich in history, blessed with beautiful landscapes and views, and fortunate to be located an hour from the N.C. mountains, 4 hours from the Carolina beaches, 50 minutes from Charlotte and 40 minutes from Winston Salem, Statesville is truly "where it all comes together".
