Since then I've been sitting with the tension that naturally follows: How do we stretch wide enough to make room for others—without losing the core of who we are?

And then last Sunday on All Saints Day, we remembered and gathered in the presence of those who came before us.

As we continue reflecting on what it means to gather, I keep coming back to this: How do we gather in a way that honors the past—without being bound by it? Can we hold the presence of our ancestors as part of our identity—not as something that limits who we become, but as soil from which we grow?

I also had someone ask me this week: What do we do with ancestors who were harmful, or part of oppressive histories? And I want to say honestly:

That's a really good question. And I don't have a neat answer.

It's something I'm still thinking about—how we hold memory with integrity and truth, how we reckon with harm without erasing humanity, and how we live in ways that heal the legacy we inherit.

Maybe that's part of the deeper work of community, too. To wrestle together.

To ask better questions. To stretch—not to breaking, but toward becoming.
