Who Are We?

TIFA Life provides safe, high-quality accommodation for Unaccompanied Asylum-Seeking Children (UASC), offering a warm welcome, essential support, and a structured pathway to independence. We work closely with local authorities, social workers, and support services to ensure each young person has access to the resources they need to settle, integrate and thrive.

Our Accommodation

Our homes are comfortable, safe, and well-equipped to help young people settle in quickly and build independent living skills.

Every Young Person Receives:

- Fresh Bedding & Towels A duvet, pillow, fitted sheet, spare bedding, bath towel, and hand towel.
- Welcome Pack (Food & Essentials) Bread, milk, cereal, pasta, rice, tinned goods, tea, coffee, sugar, and toiletries.
- Kitchen Starter Pack Plate, bowl, cutlery, mug, glass, saucepan, frying pan, chopping board.

- Laundry & Cleaning Pack Washing powder, washing-up liquid, sponge, tea towel, bin bags, toilet rolls.
- WiFi Included Fast broadband with simple connection instructions.
- Access to Entertainment & Social Connection Communal spaces include board games, TV, and streaming services.

Tailored Support

TIFA Life provides tailored support that empowers young people to develop key skills while ensuring their safety and well-being.
Our support includes:

- Daily well-being check-ins with staff.
- Assistance with independent living skills such as cooking, budgeting, and household management.
- Guidance on accessing education, ESOL classes, and employment pathways.
- Support with local integration, including cultural orientation and community engagement.
- Help with navigating essential services, such as healthcare, banking, and legal processes.
- Emotional and social support through signposting to mental health and specialist services.

- Access to a mentor or support worker Someone to check in with for advice and guidance.
- Financial guidance Basic budgeting support and information on financial independence.
- Job & training support Help finding apprenticeships, employment, and further education opportunities.
- Gym membership or home gym equipment Supporting physical health and well-being.
- Outdoor and social spaces Including gardens, seating areas, and recreational activities.
