This is hard to answer as we had a change in staff in September. Adam had completed 12 inspections and I did another 20. Of the 32 inspections completed 1 (Kevin Zylstra) will not count because I thought he was in shoreland when he actually wasn't. Of the remaining 31 inspections 15 were between 50 and 299 AUs. The remaining 16 inspections were over 300 AUs. When I decided to make a list of places to inspect when I got here I was unaware of a criteria that had to be met for location and size of site that had to be inspected so I just found 20 that hadn't been inspected since the early 2000's and started there. So if there was certain criteria that had to be met I was unaware of it so our inspection goals probably were not met as far as high/low risk sites. But our number of inspections were met.
