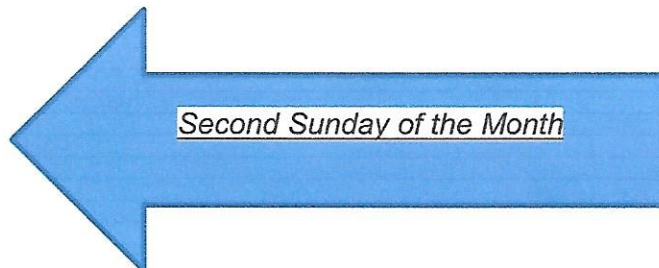


Bryan Holmes –

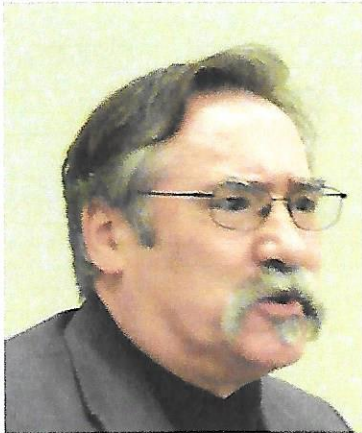

Bryan lives in Danville with his wife Beth. They have two children and three grandchildren.

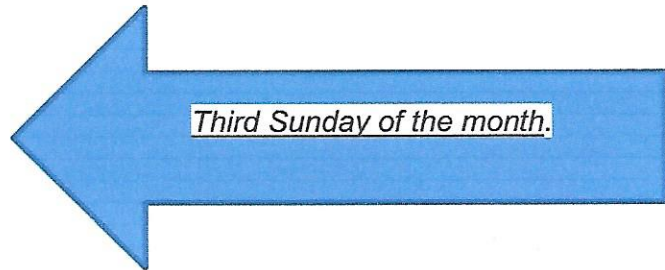


The Rev. Sally Dries

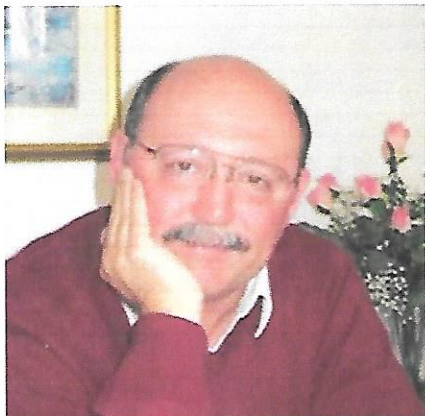

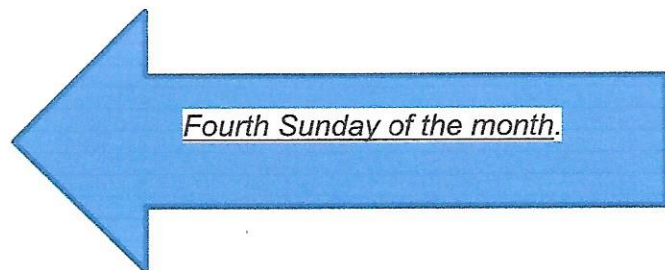
The Rev. Robert J. Andrews
