OCIA Sponsor (Please read carefully. No exceptions can be made):

A Sponsor is someone who will accompany you in this time of discernment, preparation, and discovery. They will serve as your spiritual aid, much like Ananias helping Saul become Paul by God's Grace in Acts of the Apostles. Thus, sponsors will need to fast for, pray for, and support you. In choosing a sponsor, look for one in whom you trust and find the light of the Catholic Church.

The Holy Roman Catholic Church requires the following of Sponsors (canon 874):

- The Sponsor is to be chosen by the OCIA Candidate.
- They must be at least sixteen years of age, Confirmed Catholic, and leading a life in harmony with the Faith, ie: practicing Catholics who attend Mass every single week, are in a valid Marriage (if applicable), and follow the moral teaching of Jesus. They may not be the father or mother of the one to be brought into Communion with the Church.
- A letter of good standing, from their Parish Priest, is needed for all Sponsors not currently in the Parish Territory of St. Patrick's in Chadron, NE.
- Sponsors will promise to encourage and help you grow in the Catholic Faith.
