



Selling or buying Purebred Registered Sheep?

The Canadian Sheep Breeders' Association (CSBA) is dedicated to representing the Purebred Sheep Breeders across Canada. Purebred Registered Sheep signifies they have been registered with the Canadian Livestock Records Corporation (CLRC) and a certificate of registration will be provided with the sale of the animal. These records can be found online at www.clrc.ca and is the responsibility of the seller to pay for and initiate the transfer of the registration to the buyer.

These records will indicate the pedigree information and ownership status. We encourage you to confirm the animals you are interested in, are in fact purebred registered animals.

Under the Animal Pedigree Act, it is an offense to offer to sell, contract to sell or sell, as a purebred, any animal that is not registered or eligible to be registered as a purebred by the association authorized to register animals of that breed or by the Corporation.

If you are interested in purchasing any animals or are new to the industry, don't hesitate to reach out to any of the CSBA Board of Directors. CSBA is an organization of over 1100 breeders of purebred sheep across Canada, representing over 40 breeds of sheep.

Research

10% of net income from CLRC is set aside each year for research in the following year.

Funding in 2024 to date: \$14,500

- CarLa Saliva Test for Parasite resistance (\$4500)
- Application of embryo technologies in pre-pubertal and pubertal animals for the acceleration of the genetic selection and expansion of the ovine sector. (\$5,000)
- Mitacs Accelerate Project: Improving Lamb Survival in Canadian Sheep (\$5,000)

Previous projects include:

- National Integrated Genetic Services (Canadian Centre for Swine Improvement)
- Prevention of Pregnancy Toxemia (Universite de Laval)



GenOvis Support

- National sheep genetic evaluation program
- Since 2013, CSBA has been equal partners with Ontario Sheep Farmers and CEPOQ
- The GenOvis program is a home-based evaluation program that allows sheep breeders to identify and select individuals with high genetic potential.
- GenOvis ensures the significant improvment of flocks' genetic quality; therefore, increasing the efficiency of Canadian sheep farms.
- The program is available to purebred and commercial sheep breeders in all parts of Canada.
- The genetic selection tools allow breeders to choose animals on their potential to transmit their quality to their offspring.

Combining good conformation with high performing genetics will maximize farm productivity and profit.

GenOvis Breakdown

All information on animals (familial pedigree, birth weight, no. of lambs born and raised, weight at 50 and 100 days, ultrasounds) are integrated into the GenOvis genetic evaluation program and are used to produce EPDs and Indexes.


EPD: Estimated Progeny Difference

The estimation of the genetic value that an animal will pass on to it's progeny. GenOvis estimates for 15 important economic traits.


Index: The Genetic Selection Index

A single number used to select for several traits at once. GenOvis has 6 genetic selection indexes and combines different EPDs
