




Evaluation of the forelimbs

Forelimb evaluation

WELL PLACED	NARROW AT THE KNEES	OPEN AND SPLAYFOOTED
An imaginary line can be drawn from the tip of the shoulder and through the middle of the knee and hoof.	This defect is encountered frequently in some breeds. Make sure the chest is a good width.	Front legs show weakness in the knees. This defect can affect longevity.

Other defects that may affect the forelimbs

TWISTED LEGS	SPLAYFOOTED LEGS	MAJOR DEFECTS OBSERVED IN FORELIMBS	
This major defect may affect longevity and can be transmitted to offspring. Obvious lack of capacity.	Defect to avoid, especially if you want to raise lambs (for breeding) from an animal that has this defect.	The image on the right demonstrates good positioning of the front legs. The hooves are properly aligned.

Research



10% of net income from CLRC is set aside each year for research in the following year

- Funding 2021 to date:
 - \$2,100 over 3 years (till 2021) for research for the prevention of pregnancy toxemia (Universite de Laval)
 - \$20,000 over 4 years (till 2024) for National Integrated Genetic Services (Canadian Centre for Swine Improvement)
 - \$10,000 over 3 years (till 2023) for CarLa Saliva test for parasite resistance
 - \$10,000 continued annual contribution to GenOvis partnership with CGIL at the University of Guelph, CEPOQ, and OSF (Can be used for industry projects)
 - **Past Projects include:** Predicting feeder lamb performance (Govt of AB), Pneumonia Vaccine research (U of SK), Mastitis Project (CEPOQ), Forage Alternatives (U of Guelph), Pregnancy Detection research (ALP), CiDR research (SEMRPQ), using FSH for heat & ovulation synchronization (Dalhousie Univ), semen research project (SEMRPQ) , Repeated Measures: Maternal & Paternal (CEPOQ), Genomics/Metabolics (U of AB),

New Initiatives and Membership Benefits

- **Junior membership:** \$20 for members under 21 years of age (regular is \$80)
 - **Free membership:** for any first-time buyers of new female sheep, and 6th animal registered free with first batch of 5 registrations
 - **Bulk option for registrations and transfers:** pricing breaks in place based on the number of animals registered each year. A new level has been added in 2019 and rebates will be calculated at year end.
