MINUTES OF JULY 13^{TH} , 2015 TOWN COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Town Council of Clear Lake, Indiana was held at the Town Hall on Monday, July 13th, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. Present were Council members Robert Lewis, Alan Korte, Roger Dammeier, Chris Folland and Jill Powers. Also present were Town Street/Sewer Superintendent, Robert Hull and DLZ Engineer Casey Erwin. There were eight citizens and one quest who signed the guest register.

• Street Department:

A large tree at 506 ECLD split during a storm the last week-end in June and Sevit's Tree Service was called to clear the tree from the street. As the tree is in the Town's right of way Sevit's will be returning to remove the rest of the tree as their schedule permits.

The property at 124 Penner Drive has had numerous complaints about the grass/weeds along with the general condition of the property. Solutions to the problems continue to be explored. As of today Property Management Solutions has been hired to mow the grass. The Town will bill the property owner.

A solution for the roadside brush is still being pursued.

• 2015 Road Improvement Bids – Open & Review

Bids were received from the following contractors for Parts 1 & 2:

A motion was made by Chris Folland to accept the API Construction bid of \$138,458.95 for the Part 1 Base Bid for Buck Point of \$92,088.95 and Part 2 West Clear Lake Drive of \$46,370.00 subject to the review of the bids by Casey Erwin from DLZ Engineers. Part 3 of the bid for a 35" x 24" culvert for a critter crossing at the south end of Buck Point Drive could be added to the bid if the Clear Lake Township Land Conservancy would be willing to pay for that part at a cost of \$8,580. The motion was seconded by Roger Dammeier, all were in favor. A motion was made by Roger Dammeier to have the Town Council President sign and the Clerk/Treasurer attest the Notice of Award to API Construction for the bid amount of \$138,458.95. The motion was seconded by Jill Powers.

A motion was made by Robert Lewis to suspend the Town Council Meeting to allow Casey Erwin to qualify the 2015 Street Bids. Roger Dammeier seconded the motion, all in favor.

A motion was made by Jill Powers to resume the regular Town Council meeting. The motion was seconded by Alan Korte, all were in favor.

Casey Erwin, after careful evaluation of all three bids, did determine that API Construction was the lowest qualified bid at \$138,458.95. The Notice of award was provided by DLZ Engineers to be signed by the Town Council members. One copy will be sent to API Construction, one for DLZ Engineers and one for the Town's files.

There being no further business a motion was made by Roger Dammeier to adjourn the regular Town Council meeting. The motion was seconded by Jill Powers, all in favor.
