MINUTES OF AUGUST 10TH, 2015 TOWN COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Town Council of Clear Lake, Indiana was held at the Town Hall on Monday, August 10th, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. Present were Council members Alan Korte, Roger Dammeier, Chris Folland and Jill Powers. Also present were Town Street/Sewer Superintendent, Robert Hull and Town Marshal, John Gonya. There were four citizens and one quest who signed the guest register.

Council Vice- President, Christopher Folland called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

COUNCIL ACTIONS:

Deputy McCarty has requested that the Town purchase new body armor for him to be worn when he is on duty at Clear Lake. He is now working 12 hour shifts for the County and needs a second set of body armor for Clear Lake. The cost for the new body armor would be \$875. The AED device kept in the police vehicle is in need of replacement. The current device is dated 1999, the batteries need to be replaced and would be more than \$350. The cost of a new AED with a 7 year warranty is \$1,295. The council gave approval for both expenditures.

2. Fremont Fire Department – July 2015 was given by Jill Powers

There were a total of 56 calls for the month of July: five medic assists to the Town of Clear Lake, two of which were for tree service climbing accidents. Landing zones were designated at the Catholic Church. Work detail was also provided on July 3rd for the fireworks.
