 - Draft Response:



- The Town of Clear Lake (TOCL) is extremely grateful for the Community Crossings Matching Grant (CCMG) program. The CCMG program has provided funding to address critical needs in the areas of improved safety of our residents and sustainability of the environment. In terms of safety, the TOCL has used CCMG funds to complete two deteriorated culvert restoration projects and began its first of a series of road projects addressing structural issues within our roadbeds causing a significant reduction in our surface pavement's lifespan. Additionally, the road projects have placed a focus on sustainability by incorporating swales in the design to capture road stormwater runoff thereby allowing it to percolate through our sandy soil back into the aquifer vs. simply discharging the water to our lake through a network of drains. Being good stewards of our resources is very important to the TOCL and was recently demonstrated by the TOCL Town Council's development and adoption of a Road Policy. The TOCL Road Policy ensures long term consistency across Town leadership in the identification, design and execution of projects making sure they address the critical needs of the community, have an affordable service life, and improve our stewardship of the environment.

2024 Objectives

Open Action Items

- 1. Non Bob Hill email 8/28/23: "The work we have done to improve residents' and contractors' requirements for handling their own drainage has the ability to significantly improve our water runoff challenges in the future. Having a standard expectation that is enforced by our zoning administrator as a requirement prior to an approved building application can also greatly reduce historical natural drainage issues resulting from the geographic topography. WCL and Quiet Harbor as well as the Moody property are good case studies for this. We should also discuss a one standard for all areas may not be the best solution either."
