



Hillsborough River Report

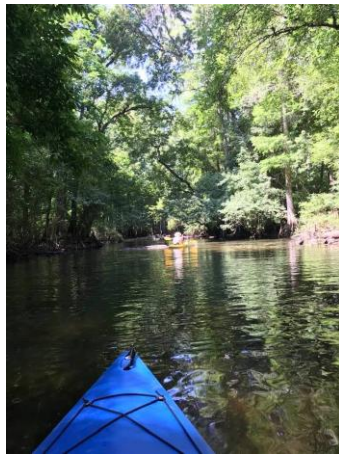
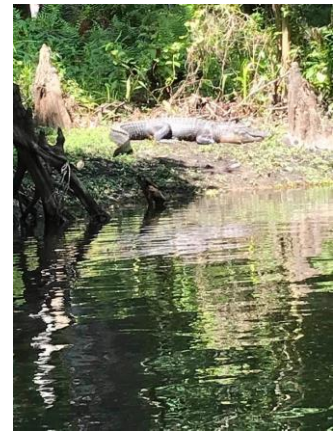
