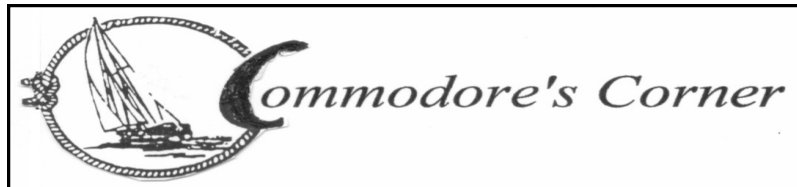

On Saturday morning, 15 kayakers were through breakfast and were ready to load kayaks at 8:00 AM.

It was already a sunny morning and we were all looking forward to a good paddling day. We had about an hours drive to our site and arrived around 9:30 AM.

It took a bit of cooperation throughout the club to get this trip together as I found out on Thursday that our takeout facility no longer existed. Thanks to members volunteering to lend kayaks, park rangers suggesting alternate sites and Bill Elliott's mapping skills, we found the Nobleton Wayside Park, in Nobleton, Florida. Other than not having kayak rental facilities, it's turned out to be a good find. It is a small park but has a nice ramp for takeout and enough spaces for parking cars and kayak trailers.

We had a few new members along for their first trip with the club. Roger decided to test the temperature of the water as he was getting into a kayak for the first time but no harm done, and he was just a little cooler than the rest of us as we headed down the river at 10:30.

This river is truly an example of historic Florida rivers. It was pristine, calm, quiet and beautiful. We did not see anyone else but our club on the river for the whole day. Not much wildlife but we did see a tricolor heron, some ibis and a few turtles.

The river has a nice current that made paddling pretty easy. I think everybody enjoyed the nice pace that the current provided.

We were off the river by 1:30 PM and enjoyed a very delicious late lunch at the El Sol de Mexico Restaurant in Brooksville. Everyone there agreed that the food was so good that this was definitely a restaurant we could visit again.

This is a 5.5 to 6 mile paddle from Silver Springs State Park to Ray Wayside Park.

Wildlife includes the usual alligators, otters, birds and fish, but don't be surprised by the monkeys! Feeding is prohibited, the monkeys can be aggressive and paddlers should use caution. The state has determined that many of these monkeys carry Herpes B virus and they are in the process of removing them. If we are fortunate to see any, please keep your distance.

It takes about 2 hrs. to travel to Silver Springs from Hudson. We should finish the paddle & pack by 2:30/3:00. If you choose to stay overnight, there are numerous hotels in the area. The Sun Plaza Mote, 5461 East Silver Springs Blvd., (352) 236-2343, has rooms as low as \$79.00 a night.

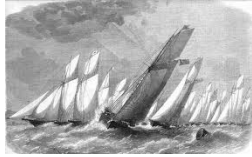
