

Silver Springs Kayak Trip Saturday, November 12, 2022

Meet: We will meet at the **Beacon Wood Café parking lot**, 12362 US-19, **Hudson**, FL, to the right of the UHaul parking lot at 7:30 AM, so we can work out transportation. We need to be prepared to leave Hudson by 8:00 so we get to <u>Paddling Adventures at Silver Springs River Park by 10:30.</u>

Everyone is responsible for getting their boats to Silver River, but any help in transporting boats for this trip will be greatly appreciated.

This is a 5.5-to-6-mile paddle from Silver Springs State Park to Ray Wayside Park.

Wildlife includes the usual alligators, otters, <u>birds</u> and fish, but <u>don't</u> be surprised by the monkeys! Feeding is prohibited, the monkeys can be <u>aggressive</u> and paddlers should use caution. The state has determined that many of these monkeys carry Herpes B <u>virus</u> and they are in the process of removing them. If we are fortunate to see any, please keep your distance.

It takes about 2 hrs. to travel to Silver Springs from Hudson. We should finish the paddle & pack by 2:30/3:00. If you choose to stay overnight, there are numerous hotels in the area. (The Sun Plaza Motel 5461 East Silver Springs Blvd., (352) 236-2343, Rooms are as low as \$80.00 a night)

Hudson Beach Yacht Club General Meeting Minutes

November 1, 2022

The General Meeting of the Hudson Beach Yacht Club for November 1, 2022 was opened at 7:30pm with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Commodore Dave Bauer began with the vote for the announced slate of officers: Commodore David Bauer, Vice Commodore Wiliam Sloan, Purser Anne Lairmore, Yeoman Jackie Kerschbaum and Directors: Membership Don Himes, Fleet Captain Dan Wallace, Kayak Mitch Lairmore, Race Shawn Rodel, Social Nancy Colson, Finance Patti Woja, Publicity Jackie Kerschbaum, Publications Guy Colson, Website Don Himes, There being no nominations from the floor, a vote of acclimation was made and passed unanimously. The next board meeting will be on Tuesday, November 15, time and place to be determined for old and new board members to hand over material to successors unless done tonight. The December board meeting will be working on the budget for 2023 with the new board.

Tickets are available tonight for the Hudson to Hooters wing fest and Christmas Party at Harold Selt-zer's Restaurant at 6;30pm December 10th. For Hudson to Hooters the last date to sign up with Eric Glaser is tonight so he can order the right amount of food at Hooters. Christmas Party tickets are \$25 per person for choice of 4 entrees plus salad, 2 sides, coffee, tea and soda, and dessert. Bar drinks are cash, there will be music (The Three Guys from Steak Fry) and door prizes. The club is covering tax, tip and room fee. We are restricted to 50 people so get your tickets early. Thanksgiving day is the deadline to at least tell Nancy you want a ticket. If it is not paid for soon after, it will be sold to someone on a waiting list.

Racing director Eric Glaser announced the race on 11/5 which is from Hudson channel to Hooters entrance channel & on 11/6 which is off the Gulf Harbors Yacht Club channel are set. The Hooters Wing Fest will start at 2:30 pm or whenever all racers have arrived at the restaurant.

On Sunday, 11/6 after the morning race at Gulf Harbors Yacht Club, there will be a BBQ with sides served at 3:00pm for \$15 and the bar will be open. At 4:00pm, they will present the awards for the top finishers of their Fall Regatta as well as the overall 2022 Regatta Series. HBYC, Chinese Holiday Gift Exchange, December 6, 2022

We will be continuing our tradition of the Gift Exchange, which has been a lot of fun in the past. The gift value is limited to \$10; it can be useful or entertaining. Use your imagination in disguising your gift as they will not be opened until the end of the auction. Everyone who wishes to participate must contribute a gift. Each participating guest will be given a numbered slip to be exchanged for other wrapped gifts. The auction starts out by calling for participant #1 to choose their wrapped gift. For #2's turn, the guest with paper slip #2 has a choice of stealing gift #1 or choosing a new wrapped gift. If #2 steals #1 gift, then #1 must choose a different wrapped gift. This process continues on until all numbers have been called and all gifts have been given out. If your gift has been stolen, you can steal anyone else's gift until the third owner has claimed it. 
