

The General Meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance, led by Commodore Bill Elliott at 7:30 pm.

Yeoman Jackie asked for a motion to accept minutes of October 7, 2025. The motion was passed.

Purser Anne reported \$3802.00 in bank. This is without Christmas tickets and Renewals.

Membership Director Guy reported the ceremony of spreading Don Himes' ashes was a great success and Terri Himes was pleased at the turnout for the Gulf event and the Reception at Sea Ranch in the afternoon. He listed the Birthdays and Anniverseries for November.

Nomination Committee Chair Guy thanked his committee of Dennis Stowe and Chrissy Michaux for their help in creating the slate of Officers and Directors for 2026.

Guy spoke about the children he sees as a Guardian Ad Litem for Pasco County. He would like us to collect toys, books, sports-related sweatshirts and balls, craft sets and make-up palettes, games, etc. suitable for little kids 1 to 3 years old, and teens 10 to 16-18 years old. The items, new and unwrapped, are to be brought to the December 2, 2025, meeting and will be distributed to needy children in foster care.

Guy introduced our guest speaker, Anita Myers, Volunteer Recruiter for Guardian Ad Litem Child Advocates in Pasco and Pinellas Counties. There are 1248 kids in foster care in just these two counties currently. She spoke of need for more adult volunteers and also mentors who interact with the 16 and older youth before they age out at 18. The time needed is about 2 hours per month and the changes made in the children are very heart warming, according to Guy, who is a volunteer there. Anita gave information on how to learn more about the work and several people from the audience asked her questions. It was a very interesting program.

If you are moved to help out, please bring your gifts to our December 2nd general meeting. While the children range in age for newborns up to the age of 18, the greatest need usually is for boys and girls in the age groups of 0-3 as well as teenagers, although gifts for any age group are very much appreciated. Here are a few suggestions if you're not sure what to give:

- Ages 0-3: Educational toys, clothing, and age appropriate stuffed animals.
- <u>Ages 4-18:</u> Age appropriate dolls, body wash and lotions, and make-up palettes. Clothing such as hoodies, etc., cars/trucks, action figures, headphones, coloring books, footballs, soccer balls, and basketballs.

Abused and neglected children in the dependency system need more help than the system can provide. Last year with help from people just like us over 1,400 children's lives were made a little bit brighter at the holidays!


