SCHEDULE OF CONDITIONS UPON WHICH GRANTS ARE MADE

The Leeds Convalescent Society is an amalgam of several small charities founded to assist certain groups of people resident in Leeds

1 Grants received from this charity may only be used for the benefit during convalescence of eligible persons.

2 Eligible persons means sick, needy persons resident in the City of Leeds, subject to the following:

2.1 In respect of grants deemed to be from the Leeds Fund either adults or children may benefit;

2.2 In respect of grants deemed to be from the Meanwood Fund only children living in (or from) the Meanwood and neighbouring area may benefit;

2.3 In respect of grants deemed to be from the Halton and Whitkirk Fund either adults or children may benefit but they must be resident in the Ecclesiastical parishes of Halton and Whitkirk or the neighbourhood generally.

3 Such grants may be applied for all or any of the following charitable purposes:

3.1 The supply of medical and surgical aids or appliances, special foods and medicines or medical comforts;

3.2 The relief of suffering, disability or infirmity amongst eligible persons;

3.3 To defray the costs of convalescent including the expense of providing domestic help during convalescence;

3.4 The provision of domestic help.

4 In no case shall any part of a grant be applied in relief of public Funds or so that any person may become entitled to a periodic benefit from the Charity.

5 After a grant has been received a report should be made to the Charity as soon as possible giving details of the manner in which it has been applied.
