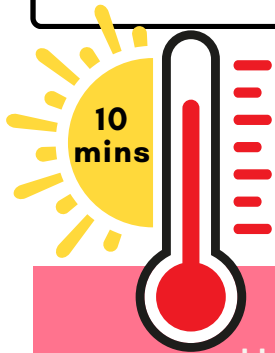


SUMMER CAR SAFETY TIPS

Dogs die in hot cars every summer. Even in the shade, the temperature can still quickly soar to **dangerous levels**. Leaving the windows open has **little effect** on how hot it is in the car.

IF IT'S THIS HOT OUTSIDE:	IT ONLY TAKES THIS LONG:	TO REACH THIS TEMPERATURE INSIDE YOUR CAR:
75°F	10 minutes	100°F
75°F	30 minutes	120°F
85°F	5 minutes	90°F
85°F	7-8 minutes	100°F
85°F	30 minutes	120°F
100°F	15 minutes	140°F

Hard panting, red tongue and/or lips



Rapid pulse



Lack of coordination



Convulsions & vomiting



Weakness or tremors



Collapse, coma & death
