Lodges not in compliance can and will be fined \$100.00 per month, up to \$500.00 and will be required to have a full Audit or Review performed as directed by our State Sponsor.

On a lighter note... I look forward to working with all of you this year. I hope to have Central District lodges work together to make some of our fundraising events bigger and better than ever. 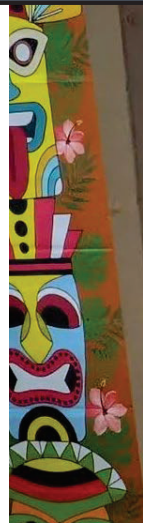

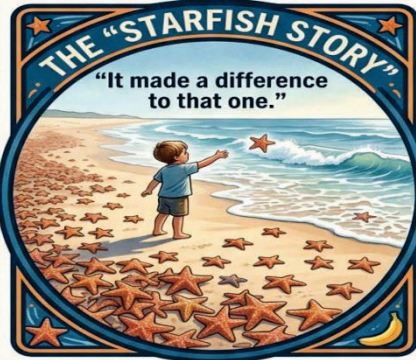

I was doing some reading and I came across the history and accomplishments of the Elks Disaster Relief Program and I thought I would share it with you. The Elks Disaster Relief Program provides financial and emergency help to victims of catastrophic disasters.

Back in 1871, when fire destroyed the city of Chicago, the BPOE by fundraising provided financial assistance to help residents affected.

Since then, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks has made it their mission to help those in need due to natural or man-made major catastrophes. The sufferance due to the 1889 flooding of Johnstown Pennsylvania or the 1906 earthquake in San Francisco, the BPOE has held out its helping hand during the hour of need.

In more recent history the BPOE raised over \$1 million to help after the terrorist attacks of September 11th and raised tens of thousands of dollars to assist people affected by the Red River flooding affecting the states of Oklahoma, Kansas and Ohio. These are just a few examples of the success of this program.

The Elks Disaster Relief Program is managed at the national headquarters in Chicago. With coordination with local lodges, assistance can be given when there is a need. If you are a community member, reach out to your local lodge. For a veteran, access to help is handled by the Department of Veterans Affairs through your local VA representative.

The Elks Disaster Relief Program is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization and can be contributed to online at the Elks Online Giving Center. Just another example of the good works of the BPOE and its members.
