There will be light refreshments offered to all attendees at no cost.



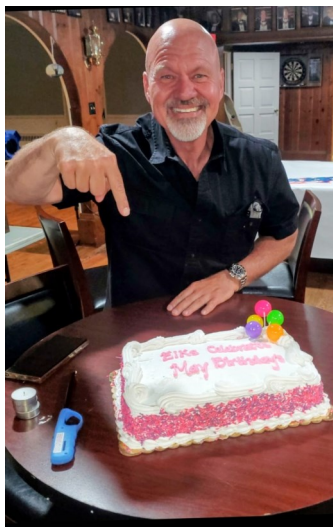

Did you come to a lodge meeting and give your committee report? That falls under your charitable activities, so fill out a form.

Turn your forms in at least once a month to me or put them in the Trustees mailbox at the lodge. Forms are available online, or on the forms rack in the entranceway. 
