From the Greens Committee

As a follow-up from the March Greens Committee report, further discussions are ongoing with our contracted agronomist as to the decision on the Paspalum grass presently on the South green. We will continue to monitor and observe this green through March and April.

Berkshire Laser Leveling has been contacted for their bid on the green preparation prior to laying of our new playing surfaces. Included with the cost of laser leveling is a compaction portion which will give us a firm playing surface. During the preparation, the water sprinklers on both greens (a total of 16 sprinklers) will be relocated to be in the ditch rather than on the edges of the green. The only sprinkler that will remain in the green will be the center sprinkler.

The dates for commencement of work are still tentatively the end of April or early May for the South Green and then July for the North green but you will be kept updated.

Tournaments

Tournament play has resumed after a yearlong hiatus brought on by COVID restrictions. The Vet/Novice pairs began Saturday, March 13 and will conclude in mid-April. Unlike other tournaments in the past, the Vet /Novice has been modified to make it comply with Laguna Beach gathering and mask rules. Gary Barnes, tournament director, stated that he noticed that this year's novices were superior to novices of the past. He attributed this to the coaching program and social bowls. When asked why club tournaments were so important Gary explained, club tournament play is a step above social bowls. It brings out the best in a player and more importantly it refines their understanding of the game. When Southwest Division tournaments resume the skills learned during our tournaments prepare our members to compete on another level. Also, our members become representatives of the club when they compete at other events. Club Restrictions

Greg Mech contacted Captain Rachael Johnson of the Laguna Beach Police Department on Monday, March 15th about possibly reducing the restrictions for play. Unfortunately, we have not moved into a tier that would allow for the use of the clubhouse or patio and we must continue to wear masks at all times and limit use of the Club to members only. The Captain did indicate that this could change soon but at this time we are to continue under the current restrictions.

As a reminder, NO guests are allowed at the clubhouse and there is no dining in the clubhouse or on the patio. Face masks must be worn properly at all times and remember to wash your hands or use hand sanitizer after bowling.

The Clubhouse is very visible to the public and the City continues to receive reports of club members not adhering to the face mask mandate. Please adhere to these restrictions until we obtain approval from the city to lift some, or all of them, so we can stay open.
