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- 1. Celebrate Your Survival. Consider the fact that you made it through! We all know others who did not, and although we feel sad that they did not make it, you should not forfeit your celebration as a survivor! Celebrate that you are still here and that you're here despite the extremity of what you've come through! Remember, the greater the journey you make it through, the greater the celebration you are due!
