Pastor's Message

The Power of the Resurrection is Still Alive...

This word, Power is indicative of might, strength, force, and is used to render many definitions in Scripture. There are other words to define power, "valor", "rule", "strength", "might", and "dominion". The principal word for "Power" in the New Testament is "dúnamis" or dynamite. Paul declares we ought not to be ashamed of the Gospel of Christ: for it is the Power of God unto salvation to everyone that believes. Power is attributed preeminently to God, it is one of His greatest attributes. His omnipotence is the Supreme manifestation of His Wisdom and His Love and it ends in our Redemption. God used His Power to resurrect Jesus from the grave signifying His power over death, and His power of the grave. Through the Resurrection of Christ God has redeemed mankind to Himself, "bought us back if you will". All of mankind was bought back to God by His Resurrection Power. For centuries men have tried to falsely disprove the Resurrection of Christ. But on every turn they have been defeated by the Power of His Might...

Scripture confirms the Resurrection: physical evidence – the Resurrection is the proof of the atoning character of the death of Christ, and of His Deity and Divine Exaltation (Rom 1:4), evangelistic proof – the early Gospel was preached including testimony of the Resurrection as a key feature (I Cor.14:1-4), Spiritual proof – The resurrection is regarded as the source and standard of the holiness of the Believer. Every aspect of the Christian life from the day we accept Christ as our personal Savior to our physical end is associated with Resurrection Power (Rom. 6). Eschatological proof – the resurrection is the Guaranty and Assurance of the Believers resurrection (I Cor. 15). Our bodies will be quickened and raised in like manner as Christ was raised Himself (Rom. 8:11).

The miracle of the Resurrection is God made it available to "whosoever believes that Jesus is the Son of the Living God and that He raised Him from the dead shall be saved"... This saving Grace and the Power of God through the Resurrection is as Powerful that day Christ arose as it is today in 2021. The invitation is still open and heaven is accepting RSVP's for new believers. For those believing Christians who sins have been washed away by the Power of the Blood of the Resurrection, whose Salvation is sure we can sing:

*God sent His Son, they called Him Jesus, He came to love, heal and forgive,
He lived and died to buy my pardon, an empty grave is there to prove my Savior lives,
Because He lives I can face tomorrow; Because He lives all fear is gone
Because I know He holds the future, and life is worth the living because He lives...*

We were able to repair and or upgrade our security system, the HVAC system, the parking lot, carpeting, lighting, paint, and install our new multimedia and sound systems.

If you look at our donor tree, you will see that there are plenty leaves remaining to be filled. Also, we can purchase additional branches to expand the tree as needed. **In other words, the tree can grow as we grow it. Mt. Carmel, Its limits are directed by our efforts.**


