

A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR

The true story of Steel Magnolias...

Steel Magnolias is one of America's most beloved tales. It was written in 1987 by Robert Harling and has been a smash hit both on- and off-Broadway. It has also been adapted into a 2012 mini-series starring Queen Latifah. The show is most famously known for the award-winning film adaptation in 1989 starring Julia Roberts, Sally Field, Shirley MacLaine, Olympia Dukakis, Daryl Hannah, and Dolly Parton. The true story, however, took place in a small community in Louisiana. Note: If you want to avoid spoilers for the play, you can stop reading now... Still with us? Okay... In 1985, Robert Harling's sister, Susan, died from complications of Type 1 diabetes shortly after giving birth to a baby boy despite her doctors warning her of the dangers of a pregnancy. This play was written to highlight the two lessons that he learned from that experience: 1) His sister was such a remarkable woman that she needed to be remembered, and 2) The women in this Southern community were so strong, so witty, and so remarkable that they needed a stage to tell their story. He incorporated both of these observations when he created Steel Magnolias -- a tale about six women who are as strong as steel and tender as a flower.

The stage play and the famous movie are very similar, but there are a few differences. For example, there are no male characters in the original stage version, which focuses solely on the six female characters (although you will become acquainted with the men via the women's descriptions). Also, all of the action takes place in Truvy's neighborhood hair salon.

If you are a fan of the movie, you may find it interesting that the doctors and nurses in Shelby's death scene were not actors. They were the actual medical team that tended to Susan (the real-life Shelby) in her final hours. Robert Harling's mother (the real-life M'Lynn) was on-set for the death scene and insisted on lingering until she could see Julia Roberts get up after the director called "Cut!". She said that it was the most healing experience of her life. In our play, the death scene takes place off-stage in Act Two – between the two scenes.

Please enjoy our presentation of Steel Magnolias.
