A Brief History of Our Church

Allen Temple was founded in 1908. The first worship service was held in the open air on the private property of Mr. Wash Tolbert, located near the vicinity of the intersection of Lawyers Lane and Ninth Street. Eventually, a small brush arbor mission was built near the location of the present church. Under the leadership of Rev. Mack Williams, a one room wooden building was erected at this location.

<u>1911</u>: Under the leadership of Rev. M. L. Flemming a large wooden structure was erected on the corner of Ninth Street and Washington Avenue. That structure remained until 1945.

<u>1945</u>: Under the leadership of Rev. S.D. Arline and with the cooperation of officers and members, a brick church with a main sanctuary and a basement was built.

The membership continued to grow under the leadership of many pastors. The growth of membership and financial resources gave birth to different departments and organizations in the church. The Sunday School was organized as the major training agency of the church for membership, leadership and Christian education. Many members served as Superintendents, but the names Hannah Evans, Susie Evans, Johnnie Walker, Alexander McPheason, Matthew Washington, Jr. and Anna Mims can be remembered. Other youth organizations were formed such as the Junior and Male Choir, YPD and in 1968 the Richard Allen Youth Council. During the summer, Vacation Bible School was added to Christian Training.

<u>1971</u>: Rev. B.C. Carswell was appointed Pastor of Allen Temple. The church underwent a full remodel under his leadership.

<u>1974</u>: Rev. Mickari D. Thomas was appointed to Allen Temple and under his tenure, property next to the parsonage on Washington Avenue was purchased.

<u>2008</u>: Under the leadership of Wayland Conner, this beautiful structure was built. The Trustees were: Sis. Shirley Ficklin, Bro. Richard Harris, Bro. Wilbur Harris, Bro. A.J. Hill, Sis. Drucilla Hinkle, Bro. Thomas Mitchell and Bro. Darius Washington.

The congregation had been led by twenty-six pastors at that time. Two of them, Rev. M.L. Flemming and Rev. C.C. Thomas served twice. Several ministers and pastors have been birthed from Allen Temple.

Over the years, various boards and organizations were established, including the Steward Board, Stewardess Board, Trustee Board, Lay Organization, Women's Missionary Society, Usher Boards, Choirs, Council of Elders and the Young People Division.

2018: On June 3, 2018, the Rev. Jeffery B. Cooper, II delivered his first sermon as pastor of Allen Temple A.M.E. Church. Pastor Cooper has hit the ground running. In a very short period of time he has made several enhancements to our church.. He has revised our order of worship, refurbished the pulpit furniture, and reupholstered the altar cushions. He developed a detailed Membership Handbook for the Conference year 2018-2019. The pastor supported a church wide clean up to emphasize cleanliness and taking care of our beautiful church building. He launched the First Annual Calendar Tea Fundraiser and also updated the methods and ways to pay tithes and offerings. In addition, he has reimplemented the Son-Shine Ministry to provide care and assistance to our sick and shut-in members.

He demonstrates a desire to increase the membership, while connecting with members and the community as a whole. We, the Allen Temple Family welcome his leadership and his family. We anticipate what is yet to come!








Mother Addie Smith Green
