Canine Good Citizen, Community Canine and Trick Dog Testing, Tuesday, October 11th Open to Rhodesian Ridgebacks Only

What is the AKC Canine Good Citizen Test?

The AKC's Canine Good Citizen (CGC) program is recognized as the gold standard for dog behavior and is a prerequisite for many therapy dog certification programs. It is also increasingly becoming required by apartments and condos as a prerequisite for residency. The AKC Canine Good Citizen certification is a 10-step evaluation performed by an AKC CGC evaluator and requires your dog to demonstrate confidence and control in specific situations to earn their CGC title. This friendly, non-competitive, and casual evaluation rewards dogs that act mannerly in the community. The test consists of the following:

- Accept a friendly stranger
- Sit politely for petting
- Appearance and ability to be groomed
- Walk on a loose leash does not pull
- Walk through a crowd politely
- Come when called
- React to another dog politely
- React to distractions with confidence
- Sit and down on command/staying in place
- Demonstrate confidence when separated from his owner for 3 minutes

All tests are performed on leash. Owners may talk to but should not touch or otherwise physically guide their dogs throughout the test. The use of "fake" treats and lures by the owner is also not allowed during testing.

Ready to move on? How about having your dog evaluated for their AKC Community Canine (CGCA) title?

The AKC's Community Canine evaluation is for those dogs who have previously passed their Canine Good Citizen test and are ready to attempt the Advanced Canine Good Citizen test. The CGCA is again a 10-step evaluation performed by an AKC CGC evaluator and requires your dog to demonstrate confidence and control in increasingly more public situations, as compared to the CGC testing environment. The test consists of the following:

- Dog stands, sits or lies down and waits under control while the owner sits at the registration table and completes the CGCA form
- Walk on a loose leash (not in a ring) without distractions does not pull
- Walk on a loose leash (not in a ring) in a crowd does not pull
- Walk on a loose leash (not in a ring) past distraction dogs does not pull
- Sit-stay in small group
- Allows petting by stranger who approaches carrying item
- "Leave it"- dog walks by food on the ground
- Down or sit stay with distance owner returns carrying designated item
- Recall with distraction
- Sit- or stand-stay while owner enters/exits doorway

All tests are performed on leash. Owners may talk to but should not touch or otherwise physically guide their dogs throughout the test. The use of "fake" treats and lures by the owner is also not allowed during testing.

Trick Dog Novice, Intermediate & Advanced testing will be offered in addition to CGC and CGCA testing!

Trick Dog Novice (for dogs with CGC title): Dogs must have CGC, plus perform 5 tricks from the Novice Trick List **Trick Dog Novice** (without a CGC title): Dogs perform 10 tricks from the Novice Trick List.

Trick Dog Intermediate: Dogs must have their TKN title, plus perform 10 tricks from the Intermediate Trick List. **Trick Dog Advanced**: Dogs must have their TKI title, plus perform 10 tricks from the Advanced Trick List.

Health Education Seminar #1: Household Hazards - How much is Too Much?

In July 2003, Dr. Wismer became a Diplomate of the American Board of Toxicology and the American Board of Veterinary Toxicology. Dr. Wismer has written several peer-reviewed toxicology articles and book chapters. She is also an adjunct professor at the University of Illinois, a visiting professor at St. Matthew's University, and a consultant for the Veterinary Information Network (VIN).

Karen has had many years in obstetrics, both human, 17 years of high-risk human OB, specializing in home pre-term labor management, and two-and-a-half decades of veterinary obstetric care. Her tenure in veterinary obstetrics began in 1994, when she discovered the lash of veterinary entries are she discovered the lash of veterinary entries are she discovered to be a she discovered the lash of veterinary entries are she discovered to be a she discovered to

when she discovered the lack of veterinary support for breeders who were making life and death decisions about their animals in the home-setting with no objective information to assist them in their decision making. Karen researched and patented methods of in-home uterine activity monitoring and fetal heart rate detection, subsequently creating Veterinary Perinatal Specialties. To date, the service has monitored over 45,000 deliveries, including early and high-risk pregnancies through detection of premature contractions and gestationally-inappropriate uterine activity. VPS has developed management protocols that have seen more than 99% of problematic gestations reach viability. Most of VPS's clients have been dog breeders, but they have also monitored cats, exotic animals, endangered species and are currently exploring the service as an aid during the foaling process.



Karen shares her home with her husband, Randy and their Airedale Terrier, Bella. Karen has owner-handled 8 of their Airedales to their championship, as well as competes in agility and Rally. Additionally, Karen was also instrumental in getting the Airedale breed admitted into the AKC for upland hunt tests.

Classifications

4-6 MONTHS BEGINNER PUPPY COMPETITION

This class will be offered for Rhodesian Ridgebacks that are four months of age but under six months of age <u>on the first</u> <u>day of the National Specialty regular classes</u> (Thursday, October 13, 2022). Indicate 4-6 mos. class on the official AKC entry form; an AKC registration or an AKC litter number is required at the time of entry. Foreign born dogs may be entered in this class if they are registered in the country of origin. All entrants are to be vaccinated (including rabies) in accordance with their veterinarian's protocol. This class is not divided by sex. There is no further competition for winner of this event.

<u>Professional handlers are not permitted to exhibit in this class.</u> Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay. Dogs may not be exhibited by current assistants and household members of a professional handler.

This class is restricted to exhibitors who have not, at any point in time, been a professional dog handler, AKC approved conformation judge, or employed as an assistant to a professional handler. Additionally, members of the immediate family or household of a current professional handler are ineligible for this class (as defined in Chapter 11, Section 13).

<u>BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS (NOW SPLIT INTO 6 MOS. - UNDER 12 MOS. AND OVER 12 MOS.</u>) shall be for dogs that are, six months of age or older as of the first day of the show; not Champions on the date of closing of entries for the show; individually registered with The American Kennel Club as of the date of the show; owned or co-owned by any of the breeders of record as of the date of the show. The person handling the dog in this class must be a breeder of record and an owner of record of this dog. In any subsequent classes for which a dog from the Bred-by-Exhibitor class becomes eligible, there are no restrictions as to who may handle.

<u>AMERICAN BRED CLASS</u> shall be for all dogs (except champions) six months of age and over, whelped in the United States of America, by reason of a mating which took place in the United States of America.

<u>BEST OF BREED CLASS</u> is for dogs that are Champions of Record. The entry and showing of dogs whose championships are unconfirmed is limited to a period of 90 days from the date of the show where a dog completed the requirements for a championship according to the owner's records. If, at the end of the 90-day period, the championship of a dog has not been confirmed by AKC, no further entries of the dog for Best of Breed competition are to be made until its championship has been confirmed by AKC.



NON-REGULAR CLASSES, SINGLE DOG ENTRIES

VETERAN CLASSES – FOR DOGS AND BITCHES

• VETERAN 7-9 (7 YEARS BUT UNDER 9 YEARS) • VETERAN 9-11 (9 YEARS BUT UNDER 11 YEARS) • VETERAN 11+ (11 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER)

The winner of each Veteran Dog Class and each Veteran Bitch Class will be eligible for Best of Breed Competition. <u>BEST VETERAN</u> After completion of Best of Breed competition, the Winners of each Veteran Dog Class and each Veteran Bitch Class will compete for Best Veteran. If a Veteran Dog or Bitch is selected Best of Breed, Best of Opposite, Select Dog or Select Bitch, or receives an AOM they will automatically be Best Veteran. If one of each sex receives one of the above awards the higher of the awards will be Best Veteran. *Note:* AKC Rules Applying to Dog Shows Chapter 11, Section 8. <u>Neutered Dogs and Spayed Bitches may compete in the Veterans Classes only at independent specialties</u>.

FIELD CHAMPION - FOR DOGS AND BITCHES

Dogs and bitches that have earned a Field Championship from AKC or ASFA will automatically be given the title of RRFCH to qualify for entry in these classes. The Field Championship Classes are open to any Rhodesian Ridgeback with that title. *No altered dogs or bitches may be entered in field Championship Classes*. Each of the class winners is eligible for Best of Breed Competition.

ALTERED CLASS – FOR DOGS AND BITCHES

Open to Altered dogs and Spayed bitches 6 months of age and older; *not open to ILP registered dogs*. Winners of the Altered Classes will not be eligible to compete for Best of Breed competition.



NON-REGULAR CLASSES, MULTIPLE DOG ENTRIES

STUD DOG CLASS

For Stud Dogs and two of their Get. It is not necessary that the Get be under the same ownership as that of the Stud Dog. Dogs may be entered separately in one of the regular classes, or if a Champion of Record, in Best of Breed competition. However, the Stud Dog MUST be entered in the Stud Dog Class and the get MUST be entered in one of the regular classes. The Stud Dog Class shall be considered as one entry and requires one entry fee, this being the fee plus the additional class fee if the Stud Dog is entered in another class. The Stud Dog must be shown in the ring with the Get. The class will be judged on the merits of the Get. While the merits of the Stud Dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the Stud Dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require it disqualification or being excused under the Dog Show rules, AKC policy or the standard for the Breed.

BROOD BITCH CLASS

Same as Stud Dog Class except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Produce for Get.

AKC Rules Applying to Dog Shows. Chapter 11. Section 8 NOTE: Chapter 11, Section 8 of the "Rules Applying to Dog Shows" provides that <u>a neutered male may be entered as a Stud Dog in the Stud Dog Class and a spayed bitch may be entered as a Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class</u>.

BRACE CLASS

Each Brace shall be composed of two RHODESIAN RIDGEBACKS with at least one common owner and presented in the ring with no more than two handlers. The dogs comprising the Brace must be named at the time of entry. Full particulars must be given for each dog on an individual entry form. If a dog that is to be part of a brace is entered in

another class and entered as part of a Brace, specify "Brace Class" in the Additional Classes section of the form. If a dog is not entered in another class, specify "Brace Class Only" in the Dog Show Class section of the form. If more than one Brace is entered by the same owner, the dogs comprising each Brace must be so designated, "Brace No. 1," "Brace No. 2," etc.

BEST PUPPY

The winners from the 6 to 9 mos., 9 to 12 mos., and the 6 to 12 mos Bred By classes for dogs and bitches will compete for the Best Puppy Award.

BEST BRED-BY EXHIBITOR AT THE NATIONAL SPECIALTY

- All dogs entered in the BBE class are automatically eligible for the Bred-By-Exhibitor competition.
- To be eligible for Best of Breed BBE, one must check the appropriate box on the entry form indicating their participation.

All BOB eligible entries will be indicated by a hashtag (#) in the catalog. (This would include ONLY Dogs / Bitches that make it to the Best of Breed Competition & can be limited to the dogs that make the final cuts because they have, in effect, beaten those who didn't make cuts.)

- Every dog entered in the Best Bred-By-Exhibitor Competition must be shown by the same breeder-owner of record throughout the entire competition.
- No handler change will be permitted for the purpose of becoming eligible for the Best Bred-by-Exhibitor competition.
- All dogs in competition for Best Bred-by-Exhibitor must be individually registered with the American Kennel Club.



SWEEPSTAKES CLASSES FOR DOGS AND BITCHES

35% of total entry fees will be retained by the Club for expenses, the remaining 65% will be divided as follows:

- Monetary prizes will be awarded to the person handling the dog in the ring.

Any prizes not awarded will be retained by the Club.

This Sweepstakes is open to all Rhodesian Ridgebacks over 6 months and under twelve 12 months of age who are entered in any of the regular conformation classes at the Specialty Show.

JUNIOR SWEEPSTAKES

• Junior 12 - 15 mos. • Junior 15 - 18 mos.

This Sweepstakes is open to all Rhodesian Ridgebacks over 12 months and under 18 months of age who are entered in any of the regular conformation classes at the Specialty Show.



RULES FOR PUPPY AND JUNIOR SWEEPSTAKES:

- 🔊 Champions of record will be eligible to compete.
- Professional Handlers may handle dogs they own or co-own and any dog for which they are the/or one of the Breeders of record. (Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay. Dogs may not be exhibited by current assistants and household members of a professional handler.)
- 80 Entry in the Sweepstakes must be made at the same time and on the same entry form as the entry for the regular classes, by indicating in the box for 'Additional Classes' your entry into the appropriate Sweepstakes class and age division.

VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES

Veteran 7-9 (7 Years but under 9 Years)
 Veteran 9-11 (9 Years but under 11 Years)
 Veteran 11+ (11 Years of Age or older)

Veteran Sweepstakes is open to all Rhodesian Ridgebacks seven (7) years of age and older.

Dogs entered in Veteran Sweepstakes are not required to be entered in any other regular or non-regular class. Champions of Record are eligible. *Professional Handlers may exhibit in this class without restriction*. <u>NOTE</u>: Neutered dogs and spayed bitches are eligible to compete. Winners will not be allowed to go on to any placement in the rest of the show as a result of participating in the Veteran Sweepstakes classes.



JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES

<u>NOVICE CLASS</u>. For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Places, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

<u>OPEN CLASS</u>. For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Places, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

<u>MASTER CLASS</u>. For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years on the day of the show, and who have won 10 first place wins in an Open class with competition to be eligible to enter the Limited Class Competition. The calendar for this class will be consistent with the eligibility dates for the AKC National Championship. All Juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and may change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed. Once the eligibility time frame for that year has passed all participants return to the Open Class to complete for the following year.

<u>BEST JUNIOR HANDLER</u>. The Junior Handler placed first in each of the regular Junior Showmanship Classes, if undefeated in any other Junior Showmanship Class at that show, shall automatically be eligible to compete for this prize.

Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class with competition present after the closing of entries for a show may transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class provided that this transfer is made by the Show Superintendent at least one-half hour prior to the scheduled start of Junior Showmanship judging at the show.

- Entry blank MUST be filled out with the necessary information for the entry in Junior Showmanship to be accepted.
- BITCHES IN SEASON ARE NOT ELIGIBLE. At Specialty shows, dog must be of the breed for which the show is held.
- AKC Junior Handler Numbers are required for entry and may be obtained by sending a request to juniors@akc.org





2022 Endurance Trial Competition

Wednesday, October 12th – 7:00 am CAESAR CREEK STATE PARK, 8570 OH-73, WAYNESVILLE, OH 45068

All registered participants and volunteers will be contacted at least two weeks prior to the National with information pertaining to the ET so please include your email with your registration Rosettes will be awarded the same day in the conformation ring at lunch.

E-Bikes have been approved for the 2022 National Specialty

Each E-Bike participant must provide the following to the RRCUS National Specialty ET Committee Chair, prior to being accepted to participate in the endurance trial if planning on using an E-bike:

- 89 Photo of bike with specifications, including manufacturer's name, model number, and year.
- 80 Only Class One E-Bikes are allowable, including these specifications:
 - -Pedal assist
 - -No throttle
 - -Maximum assisted speed, 20 mph
 - -Maximum power, 750 watts

Rules:

- Dogs must be at least 2 years of age on the day of the event.
- Handlers may run, bicycle or use an e-bike (only Class I e-bikes are permitted). Handlers using a bicycle or e-bike must wear a helmet.
- Dogs may be run on a flat collar, martingale collar, harness or head-halter. Neither slip collars (sometimes called "choke chains") nor prong collars are permitted.
- Bitches in season are not permitted to compete.
- If the temperature reaches 80 degrees, the trial will be called off regardless of which stage it has reached.

Trial Procedures:

- Check-in and initial obedience tests will begin at 6 a.m. Please check-in no later than 6:30 a.m.
- Starting groups will be spaced 10 minutes apart. The first group will start at 7 a.m. sharp. Know which group you are in and be ready. Groups will be assigned in advance by the trial chair.
- There will be a 10-minute break between the first two legs. As you come in from your 1st leg, a timer will yell your time to you. It is YOUR responsibility to be at the vet checker location 5 minutes later for the dog's vital signs to be checked. When it nears the end of the 10-minute rest, report to the timer. They will give you the go-ahead at the 10-minute mark.
- Example: If you come in at 8:00, you must be at the vet location at 8:05 and back to the starting line at 8:09.
- There will be a 15-minute break between the 2nd and 3rd legs of the trial. Once again, it is your responsibility to be at the checker's location 5 minutes later to have your dog checked and be back at the line at the 15-minute mark.
- As you finish each leg, you will be able to offer your dog water. Do not allow your dog to over-drink, which can cause bloat.
- At the end of the 3rd leg DO NOT LEAVE THE AREA. You must report to the vet checker's location 5 and 15 minutes after you cross the finish line. The dog's vital signs will be measured each time.
- Example: If you cross the finish line at 11:00, you must be at the checker's location at 11:05 and 11:15. In between these times, allow your dog to rest, drink water, and recover.
- After the final vet check, you must report to the obedience judge for the final obedience test.
- Failure to be at the checker's location or the starting line could result in your not receiving the RRCUS ET Title. WATCH YOUR TIMES.
- You must maintain an average pace of at least 6 miles per hour (10-minute miles). You must complete each 4-mile leg in no more than 40 minutes. If you go over time on any of the three legs, you will be allowed to finish, but you will not receive an Endurance Trial title.
- If your dog is deemed unfit or unable to continue by the on-site veterinarian, that decision is final, and you will be instructed to stop.

2022 TRIATHLON COMPETITION



TRIATHLON RULES

The scoring for The Triathlon will be based on scores earned in three events at the RRCUS National Specialty: Obedience, Lure Coursing and Conformation. Triathletes must score 50% of the available points in each event to be eligible for awards. The points earned are described below.

EVENTS

OBEDIENCE: Wednesday, October 12, 2022, Roberts A

The Triathlon score for Obedience will be one half the score earned in one of the following classes: Novice, Graduate Novice, Veteran, Open, or Utility. Difficulty points will be awarded to dogs competing in Open and Utility before the division is calculated. 3 Difficulty points for Open and 6 Difficulty points for Utility. If a Triathlete is entered in multiple Obedience classes, the highest score will be used. (*Maximum score 100 pts*)

Note: Obedience Beginner Novice class is not an eligible class for Triathlon score.

CONFORMATION: Wednesday, October 12, 2022, Roberts D

The Triathlon Conformation Judge will evaluate each entry according to the breed standard and record a score for each, without awarding placements or trophies. *(Maximum score 100 pts.)* Each Triathlete must also be entered in a single entry AKC Conformation class at the Specialty; Sweepstakes, Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Brace, and Jr Showmanship classes are not eligible.

LURE COURSING: Monday, October 10, 2022 – Hisey Park

The Triathlon score for Lure Coursing will be the total AKC score divided by two and then multiplied by 22%. (This assumes two judges. In the event that only one judge is used, an AKC score would not be divided.) Singles Stake entries are not eligible. *(Maximum score 100 pts.)*

- To calculate the final Triathlon score, the points from the three events will be added and the dog or bitch with the highest combined score declared Best in Triathlon. The next five highest scoring dogs/bitches will be awarded the 1st through 5th Triathlon Select Awards. All Triathletes will receive a ribbon of thanks and congratulations for their efforts.
- In the event of a tie in the Triathlon, a Tiebreaker Score will be calculated. The tied dog's performances in AKC Conformation shall be compared based on the number of dogs defeated (Bowen System) and the winner awarded 1 tiebreaker point. The tied dog's performances in Obedience shall be compared based on the score awarded by the judge and the winner awarded 1 tiebreaker point. The tied dog's performances in Coursing shall be compared based on the total score (prelim + final run) awarded by the judge(s) and the winner awarded 1 tiebreaker point. These points will be added and the dog with the highest Tiebreaker Score will be awarded the higher Triathlon placement. In the event that the Tiebreaker Scores are equal, the dog with the higher Triathlon placement.

KENNEL STAKE: An entry shall consist of two hounds, designated at the time of entry, owned and living with the same person. The individual Triathlon scores of the two hounds will be added and the highest combined score will be awarded the Triathlon Kennel Stake Award.

BREEDER STAKE: An entry shall consist of two hounds, designated at the time of entry, bred or co-bred by the same person. The individual Triathlon scores of the two hounds will be added and the highest combined score will be awarded the Triathlon Breeder Stake Award.

- An owner or breeder may have more than one entry in the Kennel or Breeder Stakes.
- Breeder and Kennel Stake entries may consist of the identical pairing of dogs, but each dog may only be netered once in each stake.

For example:



• No entry shall be made, and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

<u>OPEN</u>: Open to Rhodesian Ridgebacks that have obtained an AKC Qualified Courser (QC) or ASFA certification course certificate. This requirement will be waived for hounds that have earned a Field Championship title from the American Sighthound Field Association (ASFA) or the Canadian Kennel Club (CKC). ASFA or CKC Field Champions must submit a copy of their title certificate to the host club when they enter their first AKC Open Stake. This copy must be included when the results of the trial are sent to AKC. Championship points earned from the Open Stake will only count toward a Field Champion title. Hounds that have earned an AKC Field Championship title are not eligible to enter the Open Stake.

<u>SPECIALS</u>: Open to Rhodesian Ridgebacks that have earned their AKC Field Championship titles. Championship points earned from the Specials Stake will count toward Lure Courser Excellent (LCX) titles.

<u>VETERAN</u>: Open to Rhodesian Ridgebacks which are eligible to enter Open or Special stakes and meet the age requirement for a veteran as established by the breed's parent club – 7 years of age for Rhodesian Ridgebacks. Lure Coursing tests and trials shall be open to eligible breeds one year of age or older. This is a RHODESIAN RIDGEBACK ONLY SPECIALTY TRIAL. Eligible dogs must be either individually registered with AKC, recorded with FSS, individually registered with a foreign registry organization whose pedigrees are acceptable for AKC registration, or that have been granted a Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL/ILP). Hounds may not be entered as "registration pending" or "PAL/ILP pending" whose pedigrees are acceptable for AKC registration. A dog with an AKC Limited Registration shall be eligible to be entered in Lure Coursing tests and trials, as are spayed and neutered hounds. Monorchid and cryptorchid hounds and ridgeless hounds are ineligible to participate.



The exhibitor is fully responsible for entering the dog in the correct class(es)/height divisions. Dogs running in a lower height division than they are eligible for will be eliminated.

OBSTACLES AND RING CONDITIONS

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility Trials. All classes will take place indoors on agility turf. Ring size will be 100'x100'.

MEASURING and HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION

Effective January 1, 2010, exhibitors are no longer required to provide proof to Trial Secretaries that their dog has a valid jump height card as part of the check-in process. Furthermore, this change eliminates the need for a copy of the jump height card to be submitted with an entry form. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured / wicketed by the Judge of Record PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. The exception to this requirement is a dog entered in the 24" or 26" height division. However, if a Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO) or an Agility Field Rep is present; ALL dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog wicketed by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog *before* its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.

NEW Simplified Jump Height Card Process

When filling out the entry form, there is a new section at the top of the form for exhibitors to designate whether your dog needs to be officially measured. Please check the box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the *Dogs To Be Measured List*. It is no longer required that you submit a copy of your dog's jump height card with your entry form or show it during day of show check-in.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to Rhodesian Ridgebacks fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP). Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes. Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind or deaf shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under four months of age are strictly prohibited from the trial grounds.

ENTERING A MIXTURE OF REGULAR AND PREFERRED CLASSES WITHIN THE SAME TRIAL WEEKEND MULTIPLE JUMP HEIGHTS WITHIN THE SAME TRIAL DAY

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day. Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day. <u>A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.</u>

FIX AND GO ON (FNG)

As of January 1, 2020, Fix and Go On will be offered on a one-year pilot basis in order to give AKC time to evaluate its impact. FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score. Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

COURSE WALK-THROUGHS AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walkthrough period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only. Handlers with multiple dogs, at events with multiple rings may request to walk with a height group other than the one their dog is entered in if a conflict is imminent. A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, may be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog.

If you do not have e-mail and would like to know the status of your entry prior to the issuance of the judging schedule upon closing, please enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope or postcard along with your entry.

MOVE UP REGULATIONS

Dogs may be moved up <u>prior to the trial</u> in writing to the Trial Secretary by Monday October 3, 2022. Emails are acceptable notification

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely. All dogs must be on leash at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. Rhodesian Ridgeback Club of America and their agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. Rhodesian Ridgeback Club of America reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against Rhodesian Ridgeback Club of America or any official thereof.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by Vet or Judge, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

Entry fees for bitches who come into season after the closing date will be refunded less \$5 per entry if a veterinarian certification on the practice's letterhead is presented to the trial secretary prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

Dogs must be available for measuring prior to the start of their class if a VMO or AKC Field Rep is available to measure dogs. Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required. Running order sheets will be posted at the trial site and available upon request, pending move-ups.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

Limited crating is available in the agility room. X-pens and crates may NOT be left overnight. NO Soft-sided crates may be used anywhere within the Roberts Centre. Neither Roberts Centre nor RRCUS will be responsible for personal articles left at the site.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8° through 20° regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher or 24-choice height division for all Regular titing classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24° regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes must compete at the required jump height and <u>may not</u> compete in a jump height division <u>higher or lower</u> than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an Agility Jump Height Card may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the AKC Canine Partners¹⁰⁰ program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agiity trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as AI American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner?
