- » 10/6 Saturday: Forecast for landfall near Pensacola as 60mph TS on 10/10-10/11
- > 10/7 Sunday: Forecast for landfall near Pensacola as 70mph TS on 10/10

Tropical Depression 14


* 10/7 Sunday: Forecast for landfall on FL panhandle as 90mph+ hurricane on 10/10

Hurricane Michael


- * 10/9 Tuesday: Forecast for landfall near Panama City as 120mph (Cat 4) hurricane on 10/10
- * 10/10 Wednesday: Forecast for landfall near Panama City as 145mph (Cat 4) hurricane on 10/10
- » Hurricane Michael makes landfall near Mexico Beach, FL at Cat 4/5 hurricane just after 1200 CDT on 10/10 Wednesday








Key Points

1. The center of Michael will make landfall with 145 mph winds near Panama City early this afternoon. 2. Catastrophic wind and storm surge damage is expected near where the center makes landfall. 3. Strong winds and heavy rains will spread inland into Georgia and the Carolinas late this afternoon and on Thursday.

The Worst Case Scenario (WCS) estimates the earliest possible time of arrival of various wind speeds assuming the storm were to hit this location directly.

It assumes the storm travels at maximum forecasted speed of advance directly to this location. It assumes the storm hits this location at its maximum size and intensity that is predicted over the time period before it reaches the location. It does not weaken wind speeds from land or any other effects, overestimating inland locations.

We are currently forecasting maximum sustained winds of 100 mph before Hurricane Michael reaches this location. There is a possibility that Hurricane Michael could intensify more than forecasted. The table below represents possible arrival times of these higher wind speeds.

Challenge 2: Leadership

- > Healthcare executives are smart!
 - » No formal emergency management training
- > Scrambled priorities
- > Seat of the pants management



Challenge 2: Leadership

- * "no plan of operations extends with any certainty beyond the first contact with the main hostile force"
- > Moltke wanted to evolve beyond deterministic battle plans in favor of resilient strategies that could adapt to real battle situations as they occurred

Solution 2: Leadership

- > Help executives make decisions
 - » Pertinent, prudent information
 - They can watch TV and surf the internet too!
 - » What are the plans
 - » Timelines to execute
 - » How resilient are you



Solution 2: Leadership

T- 5 Days	Daily calls with affected ministries, facilities, and Corp team. PM activated. Begin executive updates.
T-4 Days	Begin to move spare generators. Dispatch electricians or gen mechanics as needed
T-3 Days	Secure evacuation assets (as needed) Evacuations should be complete by T-24 hours
T-2 Days	Dispatch extra security teams, fuel, food, and supplies Send extra staff (as needed)
	Calls increase to twice a day Dispatch remediation teams
T-24	Review staffing and
Hours	sheltering plans
	Secure hotel rooms (as needed)
T-4	Activate conference line for
hours	communication

Challenge 3: Associates

- > Personal preparedness must be addressed
 - Onboarding and annual competencies
- > Hospitals are not shelters or kennels



Challenge 3: Associates


> Housing

» Long term displacement due to home/apartment damage

> Financial

» May not have enough money for evacuation, temporary housing, or repairs

Solution 3: Associates



Solution 3: Associates

- > EM preparation should be a part of onboarding and annual competencies
- > Hospitals are not shelters or kennels
 - » Assess personal needs before assigning to A/B teams
- > Encourage family to evacuate
 - » May need to provide assistance

Solution 3: Associates

- > Financial assistance
 - » Hospital or healthcare charities
 - » Temporary housing
 - Mainstay Suites 30 rooms for 90 days
 - » Assistance with insurance/FEMA filings
 - » Continue pay



Challenge 4: Communications

- > All communications down
- Sacred heart Hospital on the Gulf: No onsite servers
 - » Tied to servers in Pensacola via fiber
- > No onsite radiologist
 - » Films read in Pensacola

Hurricane Michael

- > Our data issues
 - » Medical records
 - » PACS (radiology)-normally used remote readings
 - » Building automation system (chillers, dynamic ip)
 - » Phones and communication

Challenge 4: Communications

- > Tracking offsite associates
 - » Where are they?
 - » How are they?
 - » What are their needs?
 - » Can they return to work?



Challenge 4: Communications

Solution 4: Communications

- Sprint mobile cell tower moved on-site after landfall
- > AT&T FirstNet
- > Federalized SAR Team on-site
- > WIFI Hotspots





Solution 4: Communications

- > Cellular routers connected to IT systems
- > Prioritized on cellular system
- > Radiologist sent to site
- > Sungard mobile data center
- > 800 number for associates
