## Alaska Vortrag

From 26. October 2016

On the 25th October, Axel Burgheim, who has lived in his adopted home of Alaska for more than 30 years, was a guest at the Bilingual Primary School "Altmark" with a multimedia lecture about Alaska. Alaska: the dreamland for adventurers and storytellers, such as the American writer Jack London, whose books about the gold rush in the Yukon prompted you to deal with that region at a young age.

With fascinating pictures and humorous stories, Burgheim took the young students on an almost eighty-minute journey through one of the wildest areas of our world. Among other things, he spoke about the unique wildlife as well as the breath taking coastal and mountain landscapes of Alaska. With impressive slides, he also presented the different bear species of Alaska, which is also called "bear country". At the end of the lecture, the children themselves were able to become active. Burgheim reported on an annual Eskimo Olympics and demonstrated two disciplines together with students.

Our first and second graders followed the lecture in German. The students of the 3rd and 4th Class listened to Axel Burgheim's English-language lecture.





# Bear tracks and Eskimo Olympics

Excited silence in the auditorium of the Altenerding middle school. On the canvas, the image of a huge footprint of a bear. Axel Burgheim, who has lived in his adopted home of Alaska for more than 30 years and is married to his wife Vamori from the Yupik tribe, initially did not respond to the slide, but made the students think with negative information and descriptions. Alaska, a state of the USA, five times larger than the Federal Republic of Germany, but with "only" 800,000 inhabitants, suffers greatly from climate change. It not only threatens people's habitat and turns them into climate refugees in thousands, but animals and plants also suffer from environmental destruction. For example, more and more polar bears are drowning.

In their search for food, because due to rising temperatures, the pack ice is melting and they have to swim further and further out into the sea. He also denounced the disrespectful and racist treatment of the natives and violence against women and children. He sharply condemned the hunting of bears allowed in Alaska, in particular the bloody, legal and also illegal trophy hunting as a pleasurable leisure activity. He substantiated his statements with shocking pictures. Burgheim pleaded for a respectful treatment of the bears, which unfortunately are often mistakenly portrayed as dangerous and aggressive in films. He reported on his initial great fear of bears and therefore always met them armed. Later, he changed his attitude and humorously

described his encounters with bears. With impressive slides, he presented the different bear species of Alaska, also called "bear country". However, the wildlife of Alaska does not only consist of bears, but is very diverse. He showed fascinating pictures of moose, beavers, have divers, caribou, a bald eagle. There are times when the signs "Closed, gone fishing" hang in the shops and people as well as animals gather by the river to catch salmon.

Burgheim called on the young people to seek direct contact with nature. Especially in Bavaria, there are still many opportunities to make your own experiences in nature. At the end of his slide lecture, the students also had to become really active. He reported on the annual "Eskimo Olympics" and demonstrated two disciplines together with students. "Four man carry": Burgheim was content with two little students, whom he wore with his arms and thighs. "One-foot high kick": A student held up a shoe standing on a chair. Burgheim started to jump and kicked the shoe with one foot. The long-lasting applause showed that Burgheim was able to inspire and bring Alaska closer to its audience with its impressive pictures, his gripping narrative style and illustrative material - an eagle feather and a real bear claw.
