If you study and learn the following information, you will be prepared to do well on the chapter test on Friday.

All the information you need to know is included in the California Regions packet that was given to you in class. You will also need to use the maps I lent you that are in the sheet protector and the regions map you did in class.

Section A

This will be a true or false section. The questions will mostly cover information in the “Land” and “Resources” sections of the background sheets for each region.

Section B

This will be a short answer section. The questions will come from the “Climate” section of the background sheets for each region.

Section C

We have learned a lot about the 4 regions in California. Do you know the main land features, weather, stuff to see or do in each region? If you got to choose, which region would you want to live in? Why? You will be writing a paragraph about this for the region you choose.

Section D

Time to think about the different regions. You will be given a list of places in California. You will need to write which region those places are located in. Examples are farms are in the valley and Disneyland is in the coast. So review what you know about the regions and what places and things can be found in each region.

Section E

It's map time! Practice adding the following to a California map:

San Francisco, Santa Barbara, Los Angeles, San Diego, Santa Cruz, Disneyland, San Francisco Bay, Mount Whitney, Mount Shasta, Lake Shasta, Yosemite National Park, Lake Tahoe, Placerville, Sacramento (our capital), Sacramento River, San Joaquin River, Fresno, Stockton, Bakersfield, Mojave Desert, Death Valley National Park, Palm Springs, Joshua Tree National Park, Indio, Lancaster, Salton Sea.
