# **ISLAND OF THE BLUE DOLPHINS**

We are continuing to read this novel, and I want to give a heartfelt thanks to your willingness to read it along with your child! And, of course, the most important part of that is taking time to talk about the chapter and exchange ideas. This week we are going back to writing post-its while reading.

We have talked a lot about what "under the ocean" thinking looks like. We've taken a 2 week break from this (plus vacation) so I thought it might be helpful to reflect a bit on what the post-its should look like. (FYI, the following is also on the website.)

# Example is from Chapter 21.

"BAD" EXAMPLE: Karana made a skirt.

Remember, it isn't about just saying what happened. That is just the plot. "BETTER BUT NOT QUITE THERE" EXAMPLE: Karana was proud of her skirt. Sharing an opinion or feeling about something is on the right track. But I have to actually guess what you are thinking.

"GOOD" EXAMPLE: Karana was so proud of her skirt that she shared it with Tutok even though she was a little scared of her.

Writing more to really explain why it mattered is your goal. It helps to put yourself in Karana's place and think about what your feelings or reactions might be. It doesn't have to be long but it has to be more than just a few words.

# NAMING DOCUMENTS

I know, this is getting old! Please continue to help your child do this correctly. Go to the ASSIGNMENT CHECKLIST page for a fast and easy reference. Teaching your child to do this automatically before sending in work would be a great habit to build.

# STARTING OUR ELECTRICITY UNIT

We are finished with our animal environments and adaptations unit. We are beginning our unit about electricity. There will be two introductory YouTube videos for the Ellerbees to watch on Wednesday but there will not be any assignment. However, the actual thing that needs to be done this week is to make sure the bag of electricity supplies I sent home many weeks ago is found and put where your child can easily access it. We will start using these next week. Please keep all supplies safe as I will be asking for them to be returned one of these days. Thanks!
