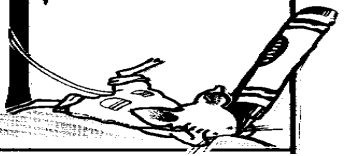

Got Rocks?

We will be hunting for rocks all month!

This week we will check out my huge rock collection. We will discuss and observe how rocks are different from each other.

We will observe that rocks can be:

- smooth vs. rough
- shiny vs. dull
- soft vs. hard
- heavy vs. light
- many different colors
- many different patterns

IMPORTANT:

Make sure you are **NOT** collecting pebbles. We are looking at a lot of those also this week to see how to recognize pebbles.
