Wednesday is your night to make sure you have your jot dots ready. It's a good idea to work with someone as you brainstorm and support each other. Even at home you can set up a chat online with friends. And if your mom or dad is reading the book, talking together will help a LOT!



We are continuing our book clubs this week! Woo hoo!

This week we will be reading our 3rd "chunk" in How to Steal a Dog.

As you know, each week we think about what are the Top 4 things that happen in the chunk we're reading. This involves choosing 2 to 3 important things from each assigned chapters. By Wednesday night you should have at least 10 events/jot dots to choose from.

Then, on Thursday, you will be able to collaborate with your group to decide the Top 4 and write 4 meaningful post-its. This is not easy and has been a challenging process.

The most common mistake is that even though the correct Top 4 events were chosen (Yea!), you didn't write enough on the post-its to explain why it was important. If you are getting feedback marked 2, that is why. (Refer to the key)

Understanding **why** something is important is not easy. Make sure to focus on character's feelings, character's growth/change, and character's motives. It needs to be something that is debatable.

In order to help with this, there is a link on our website named Reading Log Top 4 that gives more information and provides examples. It also shows the best process to go through to help narrow events down to the Top 4.

Remember, learning something new is always challenging. It is normal to make mistakes. But what matters is that we learn from our mistakes and keep trying. You can do it!!
