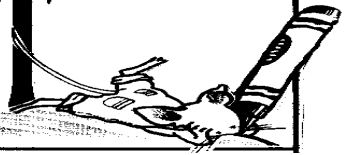

I need to know what your email is about. It is also very **important to be specific**. For example, if sending Word Power sentences just write "Word Power." But if you have an urgent question about Word Power, write **Word Power Urgent**. That one I'll read **ASAP** but just **Word Power** I won't check till school starts the next day.

## Word Power!

We did it!!! Hooray! FYI, your child's Word Power grade was entered on the Word Power Pride sheet that should be permanently in the back plastic sleeve of the Blue Folder. Please check to see how your child did last week. IF your child gets a grade of 1, please sign the form. This is just for your information.

### IMPORTANT

Time is given in class each day to write at least 2 Word Power sentences. **This means it doesn't need to ever become homework.**

Two sentences a day equals a grade of 3. Some students choose to write more, but this can also happen at school. IF a student doesn't write their 2 sentences at school, they need to email me their sentences that night.

## Pen Alert

Please make sure you put your name on all your pens. I'm finding pens all over the floor and they look identical. So I can't figure out who they belong to. Also, it is important to have back-up pens at school, okay? Thanks!



## Word HUNTING!

Last week the students began "Word Hunting." Friday (9/9) we looked at the post-its everyone had written. Some followed directions! Yea! Others forgot post-its at home or hadn't put them on paper to turn in. But that's pretty normal because we are getting used to something brand new. The biggest thing to remember is to always take your post-it with the words and **PUT THEM IN YOUR AGENDA**. That way you won't accidentally leave them at home. From now on, **all of these post-its are due every Friday at school**. Please help your child by reminding them. A good goal for the week is to have 40 words. The grade numbers are in your binder. **IMPORTANT: Please do NOT use a dictionary to find words**. Also, do not choose words used for things like science, math, or social studies (like circuit, nonrenewable resources, toyon bush or botanical.) Also stay away from nouns (like Mt. Whitney or pamphlet). The idea is to choose words that are typically used daily.
