Chisholm Trail National Showdown ANIMAL HEALTH SUMMARY OF REQUIREMENTS

The following summary is a condensed version of the Texas Animal Health Commission ("TAHC") regulations. The regulations will supersede this summary if there is a conflict between the two.

All CTYDA shows are open, interstate shows, accepting entries of livestock from within Texas and other states. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection:** The certificate must indicate that the accredited veterinarian found the animals or fowl to be free of symptoms or evidence of communicable disease and that all tests, immunizations, or treatments required by the TAHC were completed. For certain diseases, a specific statement may be required indicating disease free status. The certificate is required to accompany animals entering the Navarro County Expo Center Grounds. THE CERTIFICATE IS VALID FOR 30 DAYS FOR ALL SPECIES. Prior Entry Permit: Entry permits are required as noted in the following summary of entry requirements.

SHEEP

Texas Origin Sheep

1. Proposition sheep must be officially identified with a Scrapic Fradication Proposition Proposition

Out of State Origin Sheep

- 1. Certificate of veterinary inspections within 30 days of the move-in date.
- 2. All exhibition sheep must be officially identified with a Scrapie Eradication Program ear tag prior to entry.
- 3. Negative ELISA brucella ovis test within 30 days for all breeding rams six months of age or older. Each ram shall be individually identified with an individual ear tag or registration tattoo. This number, along with the test results and name of the approved laboratory and date of test, shall be entered on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Youth Market Lambs

1. Cambs are NOT required to have a Certificate of Veterinan

- a. Dorper ewes must be at least 7/8 blood; Dorper rams must be at least 15/16 blood
- b. Medium Wool, Dorper & White Dorper sheep must be slick shorn from the knee and hock up, including the underbelly, within one week prior to the show.
- 3. **Stalling:** Sheep stalls will be used for this event. Stalls will be assigned at 1 stall per 3 head. Bring dividers if needed to separate rams. Tack pens will not be assigned but can be requested at registration for \$50 each.
- 4. Bedding: No Outside Bedding Allowed. Bedding will be available to purchase during the pre check-in process.
- 5. **Registration:** All breeding sheep must be registered in the recognized flock books of their respective breeds by October 29, 2025. Sheep not carrying proper ear identification at time of show will be barred from competition. The official certificate of registration must be presented, and association ear tags or tattoos must correspond with the certificate. **All rams and ewes must have a scrapie tag in their ear.**
- 6. **Number of Animals:** There is no limit on the number of breeding sheep entries an exhibitor may enter in an individual class. Exhibitor may only enter one group entry per class per breed. Group class entries must be done at the time of registration.

- 13. **Registration:** All breeding sheep must be registered in the recognized flock books of their respective breeds by October 31, 2024. Sheep not carrying proper ear identification at time of show will be barred from competition.
- 14. The official certificate of registration must be presented, and association ear tags or tattoos must correspond with the certificate. Applications of transfer or pending registrations will not be accepted. Entries must be in the youth's name to qualify (partnerships between youth members are allowed). All rams and ewes must have a scrapie tag in their ear.
- 15. **Number of Animals:** There is no limit on the number of breeding sheep entries an exhibitor may enter in an individual class. Exhibitor may only enter one group entry per class per breed. Group class entries must be done at the time of registration.



Purpose-this division is open to any registered breed of sheep. The goal is to showcase production females and their offspring, as applicable to sheep production, along with instilling good record keeping skills, money handling skills

and public speaking in youth.

Record books of gains and associated costs to produce each animal will be kept and turned in via electronic format no later than October 23rd. The production books are done online in google slides. Once entries are received a link to the form will be emailed to the exhibitor. They will have until the turn in deadline to work on the record book. Examples of the slides are listed at the bottom of these rules. Final placing and determination of "Champion producer" will be based off a combined score of the following.

Live Show Ewe & lamb (production based) 30% Live Show Ewe & Lamb (placing in the age division) 30% Record book 20% Interview 20%

This show is open to all breeds of sheep, but they must be registered

The ewe and lamb(s) MUST be owned by the exhibitor or an immediate family member.

The ewe MUST have lambed on or after May 1, 2025 and MUST be the dam of the lamb(s) being shown

Lambs may be wethers, ewes or rams.

Sheep will be shown unhaltered(loose)

Live animals will be divided into workable classes at discretion of the show officials.

An exhibitor may show no more than (2) ewe/lamb projects in this division.

Ribbons will be awarded in each area of the competition thru 6th place.

A champion and reserve champion buckle will be awarded based on the combined score above.

 - Ram Lamb Division All sires must be carrying all milk teeth at the time of Check-In and Show. Sires which show either or both of their first pair of permanent incisors will not be eligible to be shown in the ram lamb division.
 - **2-Tooth Division** All sires must show one or both teeth of first pair of permanent incisors. Sires which show one or both teeth of the first pair of permanent incisors are eligible to show only in the 2-Tooth division.
 - **Aged Division** All sires must show more than the first pair of permanent incisors. Sires which show more than first pair of permanent incisors are eligible to show only in the aged class.
- 4. **Show Weight:** Official show weights. Exhibitors will turn in card for official show weight for their rams at the scales.
- 5. Classification will be done at weigh in, and if final based on the committee's decision.
- 6. All exhibitors will be shown off trailers, unless they were already on the grounds for the breeding sheep shows.

 - **Aged Division** All dams must show more than the first pair of permanent incisors. Dams which show more than first pair of permanent incisors are eligible to show only in the Aged class.
- 5. **Show Weight**: Official show weights. Exhibitors will turn in card for official show weight for their ewes at the scales
- 6. Classification will be done at weigh in, and if final based on the committee's decision.
- 7. All exhibitors will be shown off trailers, unless they were already on the grounds for the breeding sheep shows.

Judging Points

Live Show Ewe & Lamb

Ewes will be properly washed and sheared for this competition, based on major show guidelines for their breed. Ewes can be clipped up to one month out or be carrying little hair/wool. Ewes will be judged from a commercial production standpoint. Lambs will be properly washed and sheared for this competition (if weaned from the ewe). Lambs will be judged from a commercial production standpoint. Cull faults will still be penalized as will breeding soundness issues. Animals will be shown unhaltered (loose). This will also include placing the projects in a 1st – 5th place and awarding points for these placings as well.

Record Book

The record book will encompass data on the ewe and lamb. Weight gains of the lamb will be recorded by the youth in their record book, along with monetary output of care for both the ewe and the lamb. A panel of 2 people will judge the record books on neatness, ease of reading, knowledge of project in relation to a commercial setting and effort by the

youth member in maintaining accurate flock records. The two judge's scores will be combined for the final record book score. Record books will be judged, and scores calculated before the start of the show. They will be displayed during the sheep production show.

Interview

A live interview, by a panel of 2 individuals, will be conducted via Teams. Topics and potential questions will relate to sheep husbandry, agriculture, their own animals, and record books. The four scores will be combined for the final interview score.

Production ewe M Bar W Ranch 2007 was born on May 20, 2020. This is her first time to lamb. In November 2021 I bred her to my ram "Grambo" (M Bar W Ranch 917), and on April 3, 2022 she delivered twins a ram and a ewe with no help.

The ram lamb weighed 9 pounds 9 ounces. The ewe lamb weighed 7 pounds 8 ounces. At birth they were given a dose of Doc Probiotics. On April 5th we docked their tails, gave them ear tags and their CD&T shot. The production ewe was also given her annual shot at this time.

Annabelle was a show sheep in 2020-2021 and 2021-2022. She was raised on High Noon Texas Extreme feed as a lamb, and then moved to High Noon Charmasson feed during her last show season. When she was done showing she was put into the big herd and moved to pasture only to get ready lamb in the spring of 2022. I will be showing her this year as an aged ewe as well as her two lambs.

Annabelle has been a good mom, and Bonnie & Clyde have been growing very good. They have been very healthy too, and are on High Noon Creep Feed.







