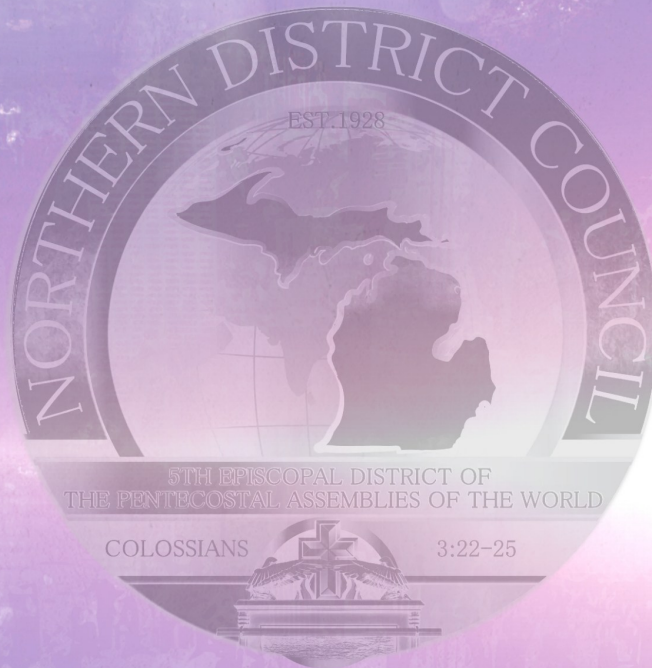

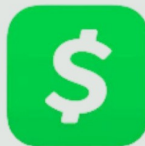

# ARTHUR SAMUELS



Arthur Samuels, was born on June 25, 1925, on Harding Street in Clinton Township, Michigan, to Milton and Oleta Samuels. His beginnings were humble, he was one of thirteen children raised in a small house built by my grandfather Milton, just a few years earlier. The home had no running water or indoor bathroom, was heated by coal, and meals were prepared on a coal stove. It was a hard life by today's standards, but it was filled with resilience, faith, and family. As a child, he was known by the nickname "Fit," though no one seems to recall exactly why—it always seemed a bit of a mystery, especially since he was such a quiet, serious boy. From those early days, his life would become a beautiful journey marked by quiet strength, deep faith, and unwavering love for family and community.

Shortly after graduating from high school, Arthur briefly worked at a Chrysler plant before being drafted into the U.S. Navy in 1943 during World War II. Following the passage of the Selective Service and Training Act of 1940, African American men were given new opportunities to train and gain skilled trades in the military. Out of more than 100,000 Black sailors, Arthur was one of just 800 selected for specialized training. He studied at Hampton Institute and earned the rank of Navy Electrician 2<sup>nd</sup> Class. Although he never served at sea, he worked on warships at the U.S. Naval Repair Base in San Diego—a role he spoke of with quiet pride. He was always proud of his Navy service, even if he liked to joke that he was just a "dryland sailor."

In 1946, with his brother Edward and friend John Andrews, he co-founded the Andrews and Samuels Trucking Company, headquartered at Linwood and Monterey in Detroit. The business included unloading lumber from railroad cars and delivering supplies to lumber yards across the Detroit Metro area. They also delivered lumber from the yards to construction sites statewide. For nearly thirty years, they worked hard and made a name for themselves during a time when opportunity for African Americans didn't come easily.

One of the cornerstones of his life is his faith. On December 22, 1946, he was baptized and received the Holy Ghost at Bethlehem Temple Church in Clinton Township, Michigan. He remains the church's longest-serving member, having worshipped under the leadership of Elder James Battle, Pastor Daisy Culpepper, Elder Alex Kitchen, Suffragan Bishop Kenneth Hoke, and currently Suffragan Bishop Donald Bradley. Over the years, he served the church in numerous roles, such as janitor, bus driver, Young People's Chairman, Sunday School Teacher, Superintendent, Financial Secretary, Deacon, Senior Deacon, Co-Pastor, and a member of both the Deacon and Trustee Boards. He was also a faithful and dedicated member of the Northern District Council. Deacon Samuels or "Deac" as he was affectionately called, never sought recognition; he just wanted to serve.

But the most meaningful turn in his life came thanks to my Aunt Betty (Samuels) Keith and a letter from her friend Vivian (Brown) Mindengall. That letter introduced him to Laura Mae Harris, a young nursing student from Georgia who had just arrived in Detroit. He told his children about their early courtship, especially their afternoons at Belle Isle, where they'd canoe and relax by the fountains. They married on December 18, 1949, in Blackshear, Georgia. Together, they raised seven children and later welcomed grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

They shared 65 years of marriage before she passed in 2014. Even through her long illness, Arthur stayed by her side with quiet devotion.

Reflecting on their marriage, He remarked:

*"I am thankful for sixty-five years of marriage. God's blessings are wonderful. He gave me the strength to endure the difficult things and to be thankful for both the blessings and the trials. I'm glad, with God's help, I was able to care for her through years of sickness and pain. God prepared me for [her death on] October 24, 2014."*

Like his parents, he and Laura started a family in a small house with no running water or indoor plumbing. However, he eventually bought the property next door and built a modern house to raise their growing family, and where he resides to this day.

After the housing downturn in the 1970s led to the end of his trucking business, Dad found a new purpose. He worked briefly for the Clinton Township Parks and Recreation Department and later joined the Michigan Department of Transportation, where he spent 15 years maintaining lighting across the Detroit freeways and the Blue Water Bridge. Even then, he found time to serve two-year terms on the Quinn Park Area D Council, 1968-1980, and the Clinton Township Planning Commission, 1970 to 1974.

*"Now, as we celebrate his 100th birthday, I can't help but feel overwhelmed with gratitude. Dad's life has been one of endurance, humility, service, and deep faith. He taught us to value hard work, to honor our commitments, and to serve with grace—even when no one's looking. His legacy is not just in the years he's lived, but in the lives he's touched."* Arthur Samuels Jr.

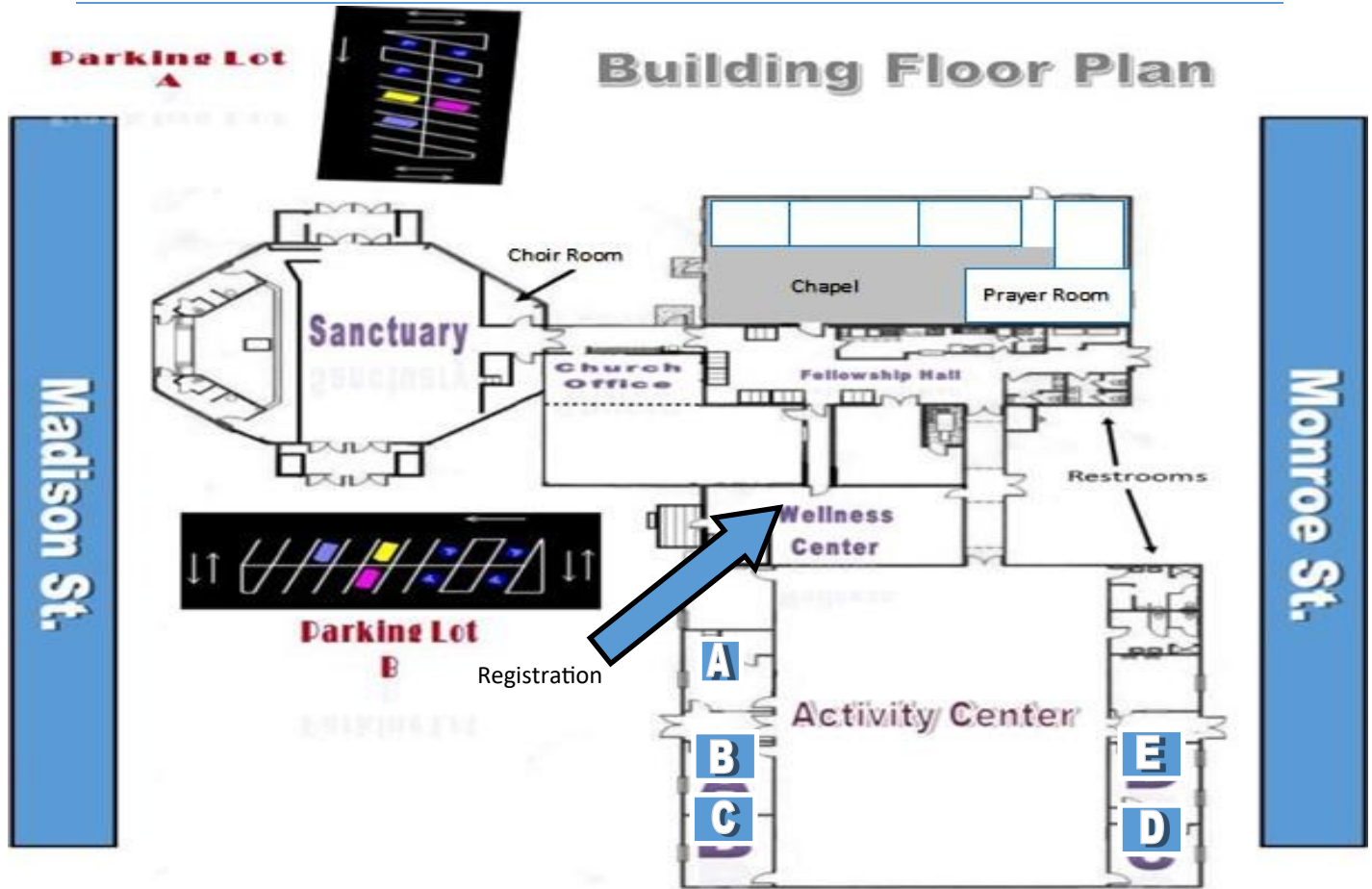
