### What is in the qualification?

The course includes units that relate to:

### How do I pass the qualification?

For each unit you need to complete:

### Where do I do the training?

If you do not have internet access you are welcome to use our training centre during normal business hours on days of your choice. We are available to support you via email and/or telephone anytime during normal business hours.
- ⇒ We conduct face to face meetings to undertake the skills assessments and assist with the assignments. This can be at your stable, the RTO campus or a combination depending on your needs.
