


Am I eligible for concession?

If you have a Commonwealth Health Care Card or a Commonwealth Low Income Health Care Card you are eligible for the concession rate of fees.

The card looks like this:

About this qualification.....

What is in the qualification?

The course includes units that relate to:
⇒ knowledge and skill in key aspects of the racing industry:

ACMQU205 Apply knowledge of horse behaviour
ACMGAS202 Participate in workplace communications
BSBWHS211 Contribute to health and safety of self & others
RGRCMN201 Investigate job opportunities in racing
RGRCMN203 Comply with racing industry ethics and integrity

ACMQU208 Manage personal health & fitness
RGRPSH203 Perform basic driving tasks
ACMHBR203 Provide daily care for horses
BSBTEC202 Use digital technologies to communicate in a work environment

*HLTAID011 Provide first aid
RGRPSH201 Handle racehorses in stables and at trackwork
RGRPSH202 Assist with transportation of horses
RGRPSH207 Perform racing stable duties
RGRPSH209 Attend horses at race meetings and trials
RGRPSH211 Work effectively in the horse racing industry
(Units will depend on which racing code you enrol in)

⇒ performance of all tasks and duties at industry level
⇒ knowledge of industry roles and industry regulation requirements

There are 14 units in the qualification. If you have experience or qualifications in the industry you may receive Recognition for some or all of the units.

How do I pass the qualification?

For each unit you need to complete:

- ⇒ An assignment
- ⇒ A practical skills assessment

Where do I do the training?

- ⇒ The knowledge training and assessment can take place anywhere with internet access. If you do not have internet access you are welcome to use our training centre during normal business hours on days of your choice. We are available to support you via email and/or telephone anytime during normal business hours.
- ⇒ We conduct face to face meetings to undertake the skills assessments and assist with the assignments. This can be at your stable, the RTO campus or a combination depending on your needs.

Fees

This will depend if you are eligible for financial assistance under the State Training Guarantee and/or a concession rate. See the following table for details.

Funding eligibility criteria includes:

Are an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or permanent resident of Australia, or eligible for the Asylum Seeker VET Program;

are not enrolled in a school (except if they are doing a School Based Apprenticeship or Traineeship);

will not be:

- ⇒ commencing more than 2 Skills First AQF qualifications in the same year
- ⇒ commencing more than 2 Skills First Skills Sets in the same year
- ⇒ doing more than 2 Skills First programs at the same time; and

(if applicable) are enrolling in a Foundation Skills Program, and they:

- ⇒ do not currently hold a qualification at AQF level 5 (Diploma) or higher,
- ⇒ are not enrolled in the Commonwealth Government's 'Skills for Education and Employment' (SEE) program
