Introducing Earth Club And Teach About Trash

Hi i am Nina and these are my friend Camila and Siobhan, first i'm going to tell you why it's wrong to litter. legally dumped garbage can kill or stunt plant growth. Many small animals crawl into bottles or jars and get stuck and starve to death. Birds, small animals and water creatures eat or get tangled in plastic bags or plastic holders.

Hi i'm siobhan and i'm going to tell you about why litter is harmful,litter is harmful to the environment because it pollutes ecosystems, harms wildlife by entanglement or ingestion, and degrades habitats, while also potentially contributing to water and soil contamination and the spread of diseases.

Hi i'm Camila and i'm going to tell you about what happens if you don't place your trash in the right spot. When waste is not disposed of properly, it can lead to pollution, where harmful substances can leach into the soil, water systems, and the air, creating long term environmental problems.



Well Let Me Tell You What Goes In Each Bin

Compost: vegetables, scraps, coffee grounds, eggshells, grass .



Recycling: most paper, plastic, Food Tins, books, maybe even cardboard.



Trash: discarded food, broken glass, and things that can not go in the compostable or in the recycling.

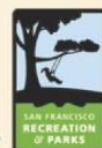
