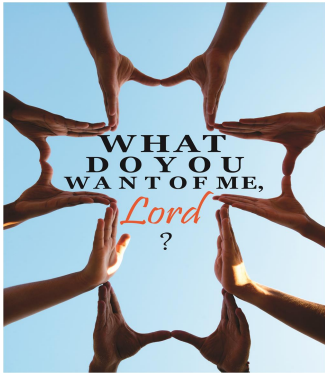

Oct. 5th - School Walkathon! Dismissal at 1:00pm

We will begin our long Thanksgiving weekend with our annual walkathon. As you know, this is our major fundraiser for the year and we ask for your support. Our day will begin at the usual time, and we will proceed to the church for 9:00am Mass. From the church, the students will walk to Trout Lake to begin the walkathon. After completing their walk, they will return to St. Joseph's to be dismissed at 1:00pm. The students must be dressed in the St. Joseph's gym strip, with jackets or sweatshirts, as appropriate for the weather. They also

need to bring a water bottle which is labelled with their names to carry on the walk and a snack if they so choose. All students must walk with their classes throughout the entire morning. Please remind your children that Trout Lake is a public place, and that they must share the track with other people and not litter. There will be parents stationed at various points around Trout Lake to help to supervise and provide support to the students. **If you have volunteered to help us on that day, please ensure that you arrive at the school for a meeting at 8:45 in the**

gym. All pledges must be submitted to the office by Monday, October 15 in order for the students to be eligible for the great prizes. Those students who collect \$300 or more will be eligible for the grand prize. Those who collect over \$200 will be eligible for the second prize and over \$100 for third prize. In addition, for every \$25.00 that the students collect, their names are entered in the draw for the other prizes. The more you bring in, the greater your chance to win a prize!

IMPORTANT IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION

Grade 6's:

There will be an immunization clinic for Grade 6's and ongoing at the school on Wednesday, October 17th.

Consents will be sent home soon. Please review them carefully and return to school as soon as possible. I will be meeting with the Grade 6's to talk about immunization but please also have a conversation with your child as well. Please ensure that your child has a good

breakfast on the morning of the clinic.

Kindergarten:

Immunization notices were given to parents at the K orientation indicating what your child still needs to be completely protected at Kindergarten age. If you haven't got your child immunized yet, now is a good time to do so. You can go to your family doctor, your local pharmacy or your local health unit (by appointment). Please

send dates as soon as possible so we can update your child's record and keep it as accurate as possible.

Ongoing/Other:

Some parents may get consents (new to school and from out of province) or reminder letters (your child was immunized at school already but still needs some ongoing vaccines). These will be sent out soon. Thank you, Cindy Diett School Nurse

Please note that there are students and staff members at our school with severe nut allergies. It is important to realize that nut allergies are life long and exposure to even trace amounts of nuts can be life threatening. Prevention of a reaction is vital for these children. The school community can help in several ways:

- Do not send nuts or nut containing products to school with your child. Many companies are now producing nut free snacks and items for lunch bags.
- Keep Halloween, Easter and any other holiday candy at home.
- If celebrating an event, consider bringing a non-food item like stickers or playing music or games instead.
- Encourage your child to wash his or her hands with soap and water before and after meals.
- Ask your child not to share food with others.

With everyone's help, we can make the school environment safe for all children and staff.

Homework

Please be reminded that the students are expected to read (or be read to) for at least 20 minutes each day and to complete a certain amount of homework each night, dependent on the age level of the child. We ask that you continue to monitor your child's work and ensure that it is being completed every night. By the same token, if your child appears to be spending excessive amounts of time on nightly homework, please see his or her teacher in order to discuss this issue.
