

Cultural Diversity Day

On Monday, November 30, we will spend time learning about other cultures and appreciating our similarities and differences. On that day, the students may wear blue and white clothing instead of their uniforms, to symbolize the peace that we pray for in our world and which we are trying to build in our school and our homes. Given

the intolerance and unrest that we are witnessing regularly in our world on the news, we feel it is important to take a day to reflect upon our individual roles in building a world of acceptance, respect and peace. We are looking forward to a wonderful day of insight and discussion with the students.

Bottle Returns

As you know, we are not able to have our regular bottle drives this year due to the current situation. However, we have set up an account with Return-It to have funds from bottles credited directly to our school. The process is very simple: place your refundable bottles and cans into sealed, clear bags, (no need to sort or separate them) and enter the school phone number (604-872-5715) into the Express kiosk; after you are prompted to select the number of

bags that you are depositing, the kiosk will automatically print the same number of sticker tags displaying the school's Express account code; then you put a sticker tag on each of your bags and drop the bags off in the designated Express drop-off area to be counted and you are done! To get you started, we will be sending home a clear bag and label to each family soon. Thank you for your ongoing support.

Winter Clothing

The students will be outside as much as possible during recess and lunch breaks this year, including on rainy days. This routine will allow them to have fresh air and will promote air circulation in the classrooms. Please ensure that your children are dressed appropriately, including boots, gloves and hats, so that they are ready for any weather.
