

## Statutory Holiday September 30

As you know, the federal government has instituted a statutory holiday on September 30 in honour of Truth and Reconciliation Day. Our school will be closed on that day.

## **School Schedule**

Our daily schedule will return to normal this year, as the mandate of cohorts has been removed by the Ministry of Education. We have removed the early dismissal time on Wednesdays. Therefore, our schedule is as follows:

8:40am – morning bell rings to begin the day (latecomers must report to the office)
10:15-10:30am – morning recess break
12:00-12:40pm – lunch break – students play outside and then return to their classrooms to eat lunch
2:45pm – final bell rings to end the day

#### Playground supervision:

8:15-8:40am

2:45-3:00pm (students who remain on the grounds after 3:00pm will be sent to the Afterschool Club and the parents will pay the drop-in fee)

## **Daily Safety Protocols**

Although some of the restrictions of last year have been lifted, there are still protocols that we need to follow in order to maintain the safety of everyone in our community:

- Pick-up and drop-off of students must be done outside; parents are not able to take their children to the classrooms or pick them up from their classrooms
- You are welcome to come to the school to visit the office if you have business to conduct; please go to the office and then exit the school
- We are not able to have people congregate within the school to wait for their children
- Parents are not permitted to be in the classrooms or hallways
- If you need to see your child's teacher, please contact him or her by email to make an appointment

## **Meet the Teacher Night**

Our annual Meet the Teacher Night will take place <u>virtually</u> on Wednesday, September 8 at 6:30pm. You will receive the appropriate links to attend. It is expected that at least one parent from each family will attend this meeting, in order to find out important information about the school in general and about your children's classroom learning.

## **Picture Day, September 21**

Lifetouch Studios will be in the school on Tuesday, September 21, to photograph the students for their school pictures in their full uniforms. Proofs will be sent home approximately 3 weeks later for you to select packages if you would like to purchase any. If you are not interested in purchasing a package please return the proofs as they are property of Lifetouch Studios.

## **Absences**

If your child is going to be late or away, please call or email the office (604-872-5715; stjosephsvancouver@te lus.net). Notes are required for all absences upon return to school, as we must account for every day that the children are in school. Emailed absentee notes are acceptable.

#### **Attendance**

The bell rings to begin the school day at 8:40am, at which time the students will line up in their designated areas and be taken into their classrooms by their teachers to unpack their bags and begin the routines of the day. It is very important that the children be at school first thing in the

morning so that they have a fresh start with their classmates. If the children are late, they miss important announcements, silent reading, the chance to greet the teacher, and morning prayer; in addition, it is difficult for children to make the transition into the school day when it is already in progress.

#### **Daily Physical Activity**

As required by the Ministry of Education, the students will continue to take part in 30 minutes of physical activity every day, sometimes during PE classes and sometimes directed by the classroom teachers.

Please ensure that your child has running shoes and an appropriate jacket each day at school in order to take part in these mandatory activities.

#### **Afterschool Club**

Once again this year, we will be running our St. Joseph's Afterschool Club from 3:00pm until 5:00pm every day. It will take place in the school and those who attend will do activities such as homework, outdoor or indoor play, and have social time. There is a fee for attendance in this club: \$5.00 per hour is the drop-in rate (\$10.00 for two hours); discounted rates are available when students register for a full month at a time. Please note that students who remain in the school after vard supervision has ended at 3:00pm will be sent to the Afterschool Club and the parents will be charged the drop-in fee for the day. Students who are waiting for a sibling who has a sports practice or other event must be picked up at 3:00pm or go to the Afterschool Club.

### **Communication**

We will continue to communicate electronically as much as possible this year. In order to remain up to date with current events, policies and procedures, please check your email regularly. Each teacher has a school email for the purposes of parent contact as well. If your

email changes during the year, please make sure that you inform the office so that you don't miss important information. If you need to meet with your child's teacher, please make an appointment so that the teacher can set aside a good time for discussion.

## **Emergency Preparedness**

As a school community, we need to be as prepared as possible in the event of an emergency, which could take the form of a natural disaster, a fire, an intruder, among other things. To that end, we practice emergency procedures with the students so that they will have the knowledge and skills to respond appropriately. We practice fire, earthquake and lockdown drills periodically throughout the year

as a school in order to reinforce the skills and help the students to feel confident in looking after themselves. Please discuss these possible situations with your children so that you can address any fears that they may have. You will soon receive your child's earthquake pack for renewal. These packs are intended to be a little message from home that your child will receive if there is an emergency. Please follow the directions on the letter included with the earthquake bag and return them to school by September 24.

## **Nut allergies**

We are a Nut Aware school. Please do not send nuts of any kind or products that contain nuts with your children to school (including nut butter or Nutella sandwiches) as we have several students and staff with nut allergies. The students are not permitted to share food at any time. Thank you for your attention to keeping everyone in our school community safe.

We are able to resume our extra-curricular activities this year. However, we are still working out the protocols that we need to follow for each activity. More information will follow soon. We are excited to be able to offer more opportunities for the students this year!

#### If you plan to deliver lunch to your child, please ensure that it is delivered to the table inside the front door by 12:00 noon. It is not possible for parents to deliver food to the classrooms, as these disruptions interrupt the work of the teachers and students. We do not allow delivery from food delivery services (such as Skip the Dishes, etc.). In addition, please

remember that we do not permit fast food (such as McDonald's, Burger King, KFC, etc.) or junk food (pop, chips, etc.) at St. Joseph's at any time. If children bring any of these foods to school, they will not be allowed to eat them. We encourage parents to make healthy choices for snacks and lunches. The children need to eat nutritious food in

order to be able to learn at the optimal level. Please check product packaging for information regarding the nutritional value of the food you purchase. Once again this year, we are not able to have birthday treats brought in to be shared in the classrooms. We must continue to be very careful with food service, for safety reasons.

## **Parent Participation**

As you know, each family is responsible for completing 50 hours of participation in the school. The areas of most need are maintenance and traffic patrol, both before and after school. Each of you indicated your preference for participation on your registration form, and you will be contacted soon to arrange for your work to begin. Participation will be logged through the OnVolunteers website.

#### PE

The students will be having PE regularly. Please ensure that your child wears his or her PE uniform under the school uniform to facilitate the changing of clothes. The students will not be permitted to change in the washrooms. Please ensure that all items of clothing are labelled with your child's name. The kindergarten students will only be wearing running shoes with their uniforms for PE at this point in time.

As stated in the registration package, families who raise more than the minimum \$250.00 in fundraising may apply those excess funds to the participation hours at a rate of \$15.00 per hour.

## Personal Electronic Devices

Please be reminded that the use of personal electronic devices is not permitted on school grounds or during school-related activities, including Afterschool Club. Students who carry cell phones for security purposes must turn them off and leave them in their school

## **Parking/Traffic**

Please find attached a map of the traffic system at St. Joseph's. We have a one-way system to facilitate drop-off and to avoid unsafe situations on Fleming Street. Please drive east on 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue, south on Fleming, and then you may turn either east or west bound on 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Please note that our drop-off and pick-up zones are located on 15th Avenue, and not on Fleming Street. It is very narrow at the front of our school and we do not want to have people stopping to drop off their children, as it is not safe. If you have young children, please park away from the school or on 15th Avenue and walk them to the playground. Parents should park on 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue in the designated area, and

zone or on Fleming Street where there is Resident Only Parking. Please respect our neighbours and do not park across driveways. Please do not make unsafe turns, such as U-turns or 3-point turns in driveways, including the school driveway, as you will not be able to see small children behind you. Also, please note that driving onto our parking lot between the hours of 7:30am and 5:00pm is not allowed. This area is the main thoroughfare for people entering our school and it is the playground for our

## **School Supplies**

All students must have their school supplies by Wednesday, September 8th so that they can organize themselves properly for learning. Stores have a great supply of the necessary items in stock at this time if you have not purchased them through Creative Children.

In addition, in the event of a school closure due to weather or an emergency, a banner will be posted on the home page.

### **Yard Supervision**

St. Joseph's School provides supervision between the hours of 8:15am and 3:00pm. Please ensure that your children are not on school property outside of those hours, unless they are participating in supervised extracurricular activities. Students are not permitted to stay on the grounds to play before or after school. Students who remain after vard supervision has ended will be sent to the Afterschool Club

and parents will be charged the drop-in fee. The staff is not responsible for supervising students after 3:00pm, as they are busy preparing for the next day and taking part in meetings. Thank you for respecting our staff members' time.

#### **Walkathon**

Our annual walkathon will be held at Trout Lake on Friday, October 8. We will gather in the gym at 9:00 for prayer and reminders and then

the classes will be dismissed to begin their walk. The students will be dismissed at the school at 12:00. This event is our largest fundraiser for the year and we are looking forward to your wonderful support once again. We will need parents to help with the various duties on the day of the walkathon. More information will follow soon, but please set the day aside to help us, if you can.

#### Uniform

Please be reminded that the students are required to be in full uniform at all times at school. The requirements are listed in the parent handbook and were published in the June newsletter, and so we expect to see everyone in the proper clothing this year. Please note in particular the following, as stated in our school uniform policy:

- Shoes must be all black and must be regular, low-cut shoes. They must not have any colouring on them whatsoever. Running shoes are not permitted as part of the school uniform. Boots are not permitted, including short, ankle boots.
- Each student must have a school sweater. Hoodies (including St. Joseph's ones) may not be worn in the classrooms.
- The following items MUST be purchased at Neat Uniforms: shirts and blouses, pants, kilts, sweaters and skorts. You will be asked to replace non-uniform items.
- Coloured hair dye is not permitted.

Thank you for your support in helping our students to wear their uniforms with pride.

Please label all items including coats, jackets and shoes with your child's name. It really helps if we are able to identify clothing that is lost and found. Unclaimed lost items will be donated to charity.

In addition, please ensure that your children have appropriate clothing for all types of weather. They will be playing outside at recess and lunch breaks unless there is extreme weather. The Ministry of Education maintains the value of outdoor activity and we subscribe to that philosophy as well.
